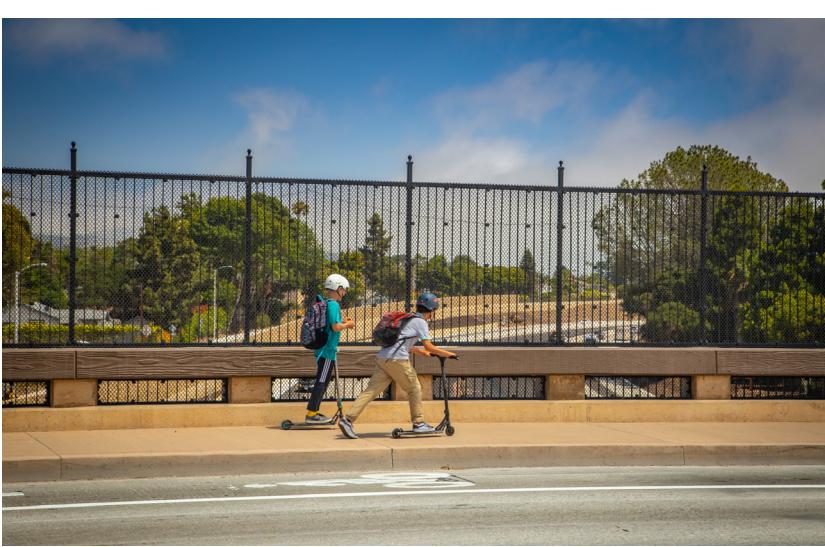

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CHAPTER 1 – Overview

2027 FTIP Introduction and Purpose

Every year the Federal Government provides states, regional agencies, counties, cities and transit agencies with funding for thousands of transportation projects throughout the country that help improve the mobility of residents. The funding is received by the federal government through federal gas taxes. The types of projects funded include, but are not limited to, highway, local roadway, public transit, pedestrian, and bicycle. These federally funded projects need to be identified in a document that allows the public an opportunity to see what projects are being funded, which federal funding programs are involved, and when the projects will be delivered. The Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP) is the document that meets this purpose.

The FTIP identifies all federally funded highway, transit and other surface transportation projects in the county (along with their funding sources) that are scheduled for implementation in the following four federal fiscal years, FY 26/27 to FY 29/30. The federal fiscal year begins on October 1 and ends on September 30 and is known by the ending year. The FTIP also includes projects that are subject to federally required action or are regionally significant. The FTIP must be financially constrained by year. This means that the amount of funding devoted to projects must not exceed the amount of estimated funding available. Only projects listed in the FTIP are eligible to receive federal transportation funding.

The Santa Barbara County Association of Governments (SBCAG) is the designated Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for Santa Barbara County and its incorporated cities and must carry out transportation planning and programming responsibilities specified in federal regulations. Among SBCAG's responsibilities includes preparation and adoption of a multi-year FTIP once every two years.

The FTIP serves as the sole reference document that the federal government and the public can review to understand where, when and how federal transportation funds are being spent in Santa Barbara County, including those that SBCAG does not have programming discretion over.

Projects in the FTIP are specifically identified in SBCAG's Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) or are consistent with the RTP's goals, policies, and objectives. FTIP projects also emerge from other transportation plans and programs including the 2026 State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP), 2026 State Highway Operation and Protection Program (SHOPP), the Congestion Management Program (CMP), Measure A's Program of Projects, and from transit plans developed by the region's transit operators and SBCAG, in cooperation with the Santa Barbara County Transit Advisory Committee.

SBCAG's 2027 FTIP is not required to include an air quality conformity determination because Santa Barbara County is not classified as a nonattainment or maintenance area for the federal 8-hour ozone standard and the federal one-hour ozone standard being revoked (effective June 2005). (23 CFR § 450.326(a).) Although SBCAG is no longer required to prepare the air quality conformity analysis, the 2027 FTIP includes non-federally funded, regionally significant projects.

How is the FTIP Organized?

The 2027 FTIP is comprised of three sections.

Chapter 1, the Overview, presents a general introduction to the federal transportation improvement planning process, as well as a discussion of the program's federal requirements and highlights of the process used to develop the 2027 FTIP, consistent with those rules.

Chapter 2, Financial Plan & Financial Constraint, contains the financial element of the 2027 FTIP. This section includes a summary of the expenditures and revenues by year beginning in FY 2026/27. The information presented in the financial element is required to demonstrate that the FTIP is financially constrained and that anticipated revenues are sufficient to match the programmed expenditures for projects in the FTIP.

Chapter 3, FTIP Project Sheets, provides information on each project's scope, lead agency, cost, schedule and funding sources for all of the projects in the 2027 FTIP. Essential project information is listed in this section according to the following state, federal and other funding programs:

- State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) including:
 - Street and highway projects
 - Intercity passenger rail
 - Project planning, programming and monitoring
- Regional Surface Transportation Program (RSTP)
- Federal Transit including:
 - FTA Section 5307 – Urbanized Area Program
 - FTA Section 5310 – Elderly and Disabled Program
 - FTA Section 5311 – Rural and Small Urban Area Program
 - FTA Section 5311f – Rural Transit & Intercity Bus Program
 - FTA Section 5339 – Bus and Bus Facilities
- Other federal programs including High Priority (Demonstration) Projects
- State Highway Operation and Protection Program (SHOPP)
 - State Grouped Projects (i.e., aggregated program amounts rather than individual projects) including: State minor projects
 - Local Highway Bridge Program (HBP)
 - Highway Maintenance (HM)
 - Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP)
- Measure A local transportation sales tax and other locally-collected funds (such as development mitigation fees)

FTIP Requirements

The key regulatory requirements for the FTIP by MPO's are specified in federal law (23 CFR Part 450) and are summarized below.

The FTIP development process and adopted program must incorporate these components:

- The review and approval process must provide reasonable opportunities for public comment including at least one formal public hearing.
- The FTIP shall be published or otherwise made readily available by the MPO for public review, including (to the maximum extent practicable) in electronically accessible formats and means, such as the internet.
- It is consistent with the long-range Regional Transportation Plan adopted by SBCAG.
- The program is to be updated every four to five years (depending on federal air attainment quality status).
- It covers a period of at least 4 years and includes a priority list of projects to be implemented during these 4 years.
- The following information is provided for each project:
 - Project description (location, limits, type of work)
 - Total estimated cost
 - Amount of federal funds to be used in each year
 - Sources of federal and non-federal funds
 - Agency responsible for project implementation
 - Transportation Control Measures (TCMs) included in the approved SIP must be identified
- The FTIP is financially constrained and includes a financial plan identifying projects that can be completed using current revenue sources and those that require new revenues. Projects in the first year of the FTIP must have a committed source of funding.
- The process for prioritizing and selecting projects in the FTIP is described.
- The FTIP satisfies federal guidance for Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act compliance.

Following its adoption by SBCAG, the FTIP is submitted to Caltrans and incorporated into the Federal Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (FSTIP). Following state approval, the FSTIP is then submitted to the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) and Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) for their approval.

FTIP Development

The 2027 FTIP reflects projects programmed over the four-year FY 26/27 to FY 29/30 period and replaces the 2025 FTIP adopted by SBCAG in September 19, 2024.

After the 2027 FTIP is approved by the SBCAG Board, it will be submitted to Caltrans prior to September 30, 2026. Caltrans receives FTIPs from each MPO throughout the state and organizes them into the Federal Statewide Transportation Improvement Program, or the FSTIP, in October. Once organized, the FSTIP is then submitted to the Federal Highway Administration and Federal Transit Administration by November 16, 2026 for federal approval by December 15, 2026.

FTIP Development Schedule

The following subsections describe the process used to develop the 2027 FTIP to demonstrate how federal requirements have been met during the FTIP development process.

Public Involvement and Interagency Consultation

The FTIP is prepared with the assistance and cooperation of affected state and local agencies including Caltrans, Santa Barbara County Air Pollution Control District, Santa Barbara Metropolitan Transit District, the cities and the County. The Technical Transportation Advisory Committee (TTAC) was used by SBCAG to ensure that these affected public agencies were involved in the development of the FTIP. TTAC is an advisory committee established by the SBCAG Board with membership consisting of one official representing each of the above agencies. TTAC members review the draft 2027 FTIP and will provide input on the FTIP content and project programming.

It is the policy and practice of SBCAG to encourage public participation in the transportation planning and programming process. SBCAG has developed and adopted public participation procedures as required by 23 CFR Part 450. SBCAG's most recent version of the Public Participation Plan (2015) is available at <https://www.sbcag.org/wp->

SBCAG's public participation procedures, in place since 1994 and periodically updated, reflect an emphasis on federal requirements including the Americans with Disabilities Act and non-discrimination and environmental justice provisions of Title VI of the 1964 Civil Rights Act and Presidential Executive Order 12898.

The Santa Barbara Metropolitan Transit District (MTD), City of Lompoc Transit (COLT), and Santa Maria Regional Transit (SMRT) rely on SBCAG's FTIP public participation process to satisfy the agencies' Federal Transit Administration 5307 Program of Projects public participation requirements. SBCAG meets the public participation requirements for both 5307 and 5339 funds.

These measures, described briefly in the following section, are consistently incorporated to ensure that the largest sources of discretionary funding available to SBCAG are programmed for projects addressing community needs and priorities, and to ensure that the federal goals and requirements are met. SBCAG's Public Participation Plan for the 2027 FTIP is included in **Appendix 2**.

Title VI Compliance

Investments made in the FTIP must be consistent with federal Title VI requirements. Title VI prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, and national origin in programs and activities receiving federal financial assistance. Public outreach to and involvement of individuals in low income and minority communities covered under Title VI of the Civil Rights Act and subsequent Civil Rights Restoration Act, and series of federal statutes enacted pertaining to environmental justice, are critical to regional planning and programming decisions.

The fundamental principles of environmental justice include:

- Avoiding, minimizing or mitigating disproportionately high and adverse health or environmental effects on minority and low-income populations;
- Ensuring full and fair participation by all potentially affected communities in the transportation decision-making process; and
- Preventing the denial, reduction or significant delay in the receipt of benefits by minority populations and low-income communities.

The decision process by which new projects are selected for inclusion in the TIP must consider equitable solicitation and selection of project candidates in accordance with federal Title VI requirements. SBCAG's Public Participation Plan and Title VI Plan outlines activities and outreach efforts to reach underrepresented populations.

Consistency with Regional Transportation Plan: Connected 2050

When state and federal funds are available for programming, those projects that are selected for inclusion in the FTIP are identified through SBCAG's continuing, comprehensive and cooperative planning process. Transportation goals and policies for the county are set forth in the Regional Transportation Plan adopted by the SBCAG Board. Major projects programmed in the FTIP, including those that increase highway capacity, are specifically identified in the RTP. Minor projects such as road rehabilitation and bikeway projects are reviewed for consistency with the goals and objectives contained in the RTP.



In addition, criteria used to evaluate projects nominated for SBCAG's call for projects have been explicitly developed to address regional goals and priorities such as congestion relief and development of alternative transportation modes.

Transportation projects included in this FTIP are consistent with the goals, policies and priorities established in the RTP. This consistency between the FTIP and the Regional Transportation Plan is required under section 450.326 (i) of Title 23 of the Code of Federal Regulations.

FTIP Funding Period

The FTIP identifies all federally funded highway, transit and other surface transportation projects in the county (along with their funding sources) that are scheduled for implementation in the following four fiscal years, FY 26/27 to FY 29/30. Projects that include estimated funding in future years (those beyond FY 29/30) or haven't been completed yet are included for informational purposes.

Financial Documentation

Chapter 2 of the FTIP contains the financial capacity documentation demonstrating how the projects included in the program can be implemented as required by 23 U.S.C. 134 (h) (2) (B).

After examining and verifying expected revenues from various sources included in the FTIP, the Final 2027 FTIP will provide necessary analyses for SBCAG to determine that the funding needed to complete the projects included in the 2027 FTIP is available and committed.

Air Quality Conformity

SBCAG's 2027 FTIP is not required to include an air quality conformity determination because Santa Barbara County is not classified as a nonattainment or maintenance area for the federal 8-hour ozone standard and the federal one-hour ozone standard being revoked (effective June 2005). (23 CFR § 450.326(a).)

Transportation Control Measures

The 2027 FTIP includes the following projects below which address Transportation Control Measures (TCMs) included in the adopted 2019 Ozone Plan prepared by the Santa Barbara County Air Pollution Control District.

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Implementation of 2025 FTIP Projects

The 2027 FTIP replaces the 2025 FTIP. Federal regulations require that the FTIP list major projects from the previous FTIP that were implemented and to identify any significant delays in the planned implementation of major projects (23 CFR Section 450.326 (n) (2)).

Major (or Mega) projects are defined as projects with an estimated total cost greater than \$1.0 billion, or projects approaching \$1.0 billion with a high level of interest by the public, Congress, or the Administration.

Per definition, SBCAG does not have any major or mega projects included in the 2025 FTIP that were implemented.

Federal funds are available for obligation for up to three years following the year Congress appropriates them. Under AB 1012 (1999), regional agencies and Caltrans are subject to requirements intended to ensure that federal funds apportioned in California do not lapse. Caltrans reports outstanding balances of federal Transportation Enhancement (TE), Regional Surface Transportation Program (RSTP) and Congestion Mitigation & Air Quality Improvement (CMAQ) funding apportioned to SBCAG each year. SBCAG must annually prepare and submit to Caltrans AB 1012 obligation plans which identify projects that are expected to obligate the balances of these older funds.

Projects such as the Route 101 Operational Improvements and Route 217/Ekwill/Fowler are complex and often controversial. These projects require extra time for public and agency input, alternatives analysis, environmental review, permitting and design. Although many of the projects programmed in the 2025 FTIP have yet to be fully implemented, progress on project development is being made.

FTIP Amendment Procedures

The FTIP will need to be amended periodically following its adoption to reflect changes in the program including project additions, deletions and revisions. This section describes the procedures that will be followed to implement amendments. All requests to amend the FTIP must be submitted by the project-sponsoring agency. The request must clearly identify the proposed modifications and include all of the relevant programming information such as project description and scope, costs by project phase and program year, and funding sources and amounts. SBCAG will consider amendment requests only if the proposed changes will not adversely affect the financial constraint findings of the FTIP. Proposed additions or changes to projects must also be consistent with the rules of the particular funding program involved.

Federal requirements and SBCAG policy distinguish between two types of FTIP amendments – formal amendments and administrative modifications – which differ based on the magnitude of the proposed change and the level of review required by various federal, state and local agencies. Generally, significant changes to the cost, scope or schedule of a project listing require a formal amendment. These formal amendments must be approved by the SBCAG Board, as well as by Caltrans, FTA and FHWA.

Minor project changes, including its funding sources, description, a lead agency change, scheduling adjustments, and other items may be approved as an administrative modification to the FTIP. Approval of administrative modifications has been delegated to the SBCAG Executive Director, and as a result, its streamlined procedure bypasses several steps in the amendment process, and generally expedites the approval timeframe by two to three months. The SBCAG Executive Director has the delegated authority to approve the administrative modifications to the FSTIP/FTIP. All other amendments require formal approval by the SBCAG Board.

Administrative modifications must be consistent with the approved FSTIP/FTIP financial plan and changes in funding must be accommodated within the available resources identified in the plan.

An administrative amendment is a minor change to the FSTIP/FTIP that does not require a conformity determination, a demonstration of financial constraint, public review and comment, or federal approval.

The following changes to the FSTIP/FTIP can be processed through administration modifications:

On December 18, 2019, FHWA, FTA, and Caltrans agreed on revised administrative modification/amendment procedures to clarify what types of changes and what threshold of changes qualify as an administrative modification and which qualify as requiring an amendment. These procedures can be found in **Appendix 10**.

Administrative modifications can be processed in accordance with these procedures provided that:

- It does not affect the air quality conformity determination, including timely implementation of Transportation Control Measures (SBCAG is an air quality maintenance area, and does not prepare a conformity determination), and
- It does not impact financial constraint.

Amendments whose scale, type or other aspect precludes use of the administrative modification option are processed as formal amendments. Formal amendments require SBCAG Board approval via resolution, and subsequent concurrence by Caltrans and the FHWA and FTA. At the discretion of its Executive Director, SBCAG may require an administrative amendment be treated as a formal amendment for amendments that are controversial, or that are determined to be not clearly within the scope of an administrative amendment.

Currently the approval process for a formal amendment to the FTIP lasts from thirty to sixty days, which can delay projects from advancing on schedule. Generally, projects that are amended in the FTIP require approval as formal amendments by SBCAG through adoption of a resolution and approval by Caltrans, FHWA, and FTA.

Federal regulations require that SBCAG adopt procedures to expedite the amendment process for certain projects within the FSTIP/FTIP and requires the annual listing of obligated projects. (23 CFR §§ 450.332, 450.334.) Projects that are eligible to use this process are:

1. Financially constrained and have been determined by MPO staff to be administrative in nature.
2. Do not need and adopted MPO board resolution.

Utilizing the expedited procedures is optional for the project sponsor and SBCAG. Projects may still be amended using the regular FTIP amendment process.

Expedited Project Selection Procedures

Title 23 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) section 450.332 allows for the movement of projects within the period of the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and Federal Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (FSTIP) subject to procedures agreed to by partnering agencies, including the State and transit operators within the region. SBCAG, as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for the Santa Barbara County Region has entered into an Expedited Project Selection Process outlined in Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 450.332 with Caltrans. The projects listed within the FTIP have all been selected based on the regulations in 23 CFR Part 450. Federal Regulation 23 CFR Part 450.332 allows for the movement of projects within the FTIP/FSTIP subject to procedures agreed to by the partnering parties. This procedure is outlined in **Appendix 3**.

Fund Management

Federal funds are to be programmed in the FTIP, up to the appropriation level for that fiscal year for that fund source, within the fiscal year in which the funds are to be obligated/transferred by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) or obligated by the Federal Transit Administration (FTA), or awarded in an FTA grant. This improves the overall management of federal Obligation Authority (OA) within the region and ensures that OA is available for projects that are programmed in a particular fiscal year.

Projects selected for federal funding must have a demonstrated ability to use the funds within the established federal, state and regional funding deadlines. This criterion will be used for selecting projects for funding, and for placement of funding in a particular year of the TIP.

Annual Listing of Obligated Projects

By federal requirement, SBCAG publishes at the end of each calendar year an annual listing of obligated projects, which is a record of project delivery for the previous year. The publication of this list is in response to 23 U.S.C. 134(j)(7)(B), 23 U.S.C. 135(g)(5)(B), 49 U.S.C. 5303(j)(7)(B), and 49 U.S.C. 5304(g)(5)(B). The listing shall be consistent with the funding categories identified in each metropolitan transportation improvement program (TIP).

When a project reaches a point that funds will need to be expended, a request is sent from Caltrans to the Federal Department of Transportation requesting verification that there are funds available for reimbursement. This verification of fund availability "obligates" the funds for use as soon as expenditures occur. Fund obligations are a measure of the progress being made on a project. Projects for which funds have been obligated are not necessarily initiated or completed in the program year, and the amount of the obligation will not necessarily equal the total cost of the project. It is possible that unused funds may be credited back when not needed at the completion of a project phase resulting in a negative obligation. For Federal Transit Administration (FTA) projects, obligation occurs when the FTA grant is awarded.

How the FTIP Addresses Federal Requirements for Performance Measures

Background

Federal rules require that the Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP) “be designed such that once implemented, it makes progress toward achieving the performance targets established under § 450.306(d).” Also, the FTIP “shall include, to the maximum extent practicable, a description of the anticipated effect of the FTIP toward achieving the performance targets identified in the metropolitan transportation plan, linking investment priorities to those performance targets.”ⁱ

The Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (MAP-21, 2012) established new requirements for metropolitan planning organizations (MPOs) to coordinate with transit providers, set performance targets, and integrate those performance targets and performance plans into their planning documents by specified dates. The most recent federal transportation legislative package, the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act of 2021 (IIJA), carries forward these performance-based planning requirements. Beginning in 2018, federal rules required that state departments of transportation and MPOs implement federally defined transportation system performance measures. In response, FHWA and FTA worked with state, regional, and transit agencies to identify performance measures that meet the requirements.

In California, Caltrans is directly responsible for submitting statewide performance targets and periodic progress reports to federal agencies. MPOs are required to establish targets for the same performance measures for their respective metropolitan planning areas within 180 days after the state establishes each target. MPOs may elect to support the statewide targets, establish alternative quantitative targets specific to their region, or use a combination of both approaches. Furthermore, each MPO must incorporate these short-range performance targets into their planning and programming processes, including the regional transportation plan (RTP) and FTIP.

FHWA Performance Measures

The federal performance measures defined by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) are categorized into three performance management (PM) focus areas. Each focus area includes an associated set of metrics for which statewide and regional targets must be set.

PM 1: Transportation Safety

Motor Vehicle Collisions

- Number of motor vehicle collision fatalities
- Rate of motor vehicle collision fatalities per 100 million VMT
- Number of motor vehicle collision serious injuries
- Rate of motor vehicle collision serious injuries per 100 million VMT

Non-Motorized Fatalities and Serious Injuries

- Number of non-motorized fatalities and serious injuries

PM 2: National Highway System (NHS) Pavement and Bridge Condition

NHS Pavement Condition

- Percentage of Interstate System pavement in 'good' condition
- Percentage of non-interstate NHS pavement in 'good' condition
- Percentage of Interstate System pavement in 'poor' condition
- Percentage of non-interstate NHS pavement in 'poor' condition

NHS Bridge Condition

- Percentage of NHS bridges in 'good' condition
- Percentage of NHS bridges in 'poor' condition

PM 3: NHS Performance, Interstate System Freight Movement, and CMAQ Program Performance

NHS Performance

- Percent of Interstate System mileage reporting reliable person-mile travel times
- Percent of non-interstate NHS mileage reporting reliable person-mile travel times

Interstate Freight Movement

- Percent of Interstate system mileage reporting reliable truck travel times

CMAQ Program Performance

- Annual hours of peak-hour excessive delay per capita
- Total emissions reduction by criteria pollutant (PM10, PM2.5, Ozone, CO)
- Percent of non-single occupancy vehicle (SOV) travel

Targets for Interstate System Mileage and Freight Movement do not apply in Santa Barbara County because there are no Interstate highways in the region. Targets for CMAQ program performance also do not apply, since Santa Barbara County is in attainment for ozone, PM, and CO and does not qualify for CMAQ funds.

FTA Performance Measures

In addition to the three PM focus areas defined by FHWA, the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) established performance measures and reporting requirements for transit asset management (TAM) and transit safety.

Performance metrics for TAM focus on the maintenance of our regional transit system in a state of good repair. Transit safety performance monitoring is focused on assessment of the number of transit incidents resulting in fatalities or serious injuries and transit system reliability.

FTA issued the TAM Final Rule (49 CFR §625 et seq.), effective October 1, 2016, to implement MAP-21 transit asset management provisions. This final rule mandates a National TAM System, defines 'State of Good Repair' (SGR), and requires transit providers to develop TAM plans. The Metropolitan Transportation Planning Final Rule (23 CFR §450.206) outlines the timelines and processes by which states, MPOs, and transit providers must coordinate in the target setting process. The FTA PM focus areas and associated metrics are as follows:

Transit Asset Management (TAM)

- Equipment: Share of non-revenue vehicles that meet or exceed useful life benchmark
- Rolling Stock: Share of revenue vehicles that meet or exceed useful life benchmark
- Infrastructure: Share of track segments with performance restrictions
- Facilities: Share of transit assets with condition rating below 3.0 on FTA Transit Economic Requirements Model (TERM) scaleⁱⁱ

Transit Safety

- Number of transit-related fatalities
- Number of transit-related injuries
- Number of transit system safety events
- Transit system reliability

Public Transit Agency Safety Plan

On April 9, 2024, the FTA published the first major update to the Public Transportation Agency Safety Plan (PTASP) Final Rule (49 CFR §673) regulating how Chapter 53 grantees would have to implement federally mandated safety standards. The rule's effective date was May 13, 2024. The MPO's initial transit safety targets are to be set within 180 days of receipt of the safety performance targets from the transit agencies. The MPO then revisits its targets based on the schedule for preparation of its system performance report that is part of the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP). See FTA's Public Transportation Agency Safety Program page for more information about the Notice.

The final rule specifically requires transit agencies receiving federal funds to develop a safety plan and annually self-certify compliance with that plan. The National Public Transportation Safety Plan identifies four performance measures that must be included in the transit agency safety plans: number of fatalities, number of injuries, safety events, and system reliability. Each transit agency must make its safety performance targets available to MPOs to assist in the planning process and to coordinate, to the maximum extent practicable, with the MPO in selecting regional transit safety targets.

How SBCAG Addresses Each Performance Management Focus Area

Transportation Safety (PM 1)

Below are the targets for PM 1 - Safety. SBCAG has elected to support the Caltrans Statewide Safety Performance Management Targets (SPMTs).

Caltrans set Safety Performance Targets in September 2025 for the 2026 calendar year as shown in Table 2 below.

States must establish statewide targets for each of the safety PMs. States also have the option to establish any number of urbanized area targets and one non-urbanized area target for any, or all, of the measures. Targets are established annually. For three PMs (number of fatalities, rate of fatalities and number of serious injuries), targets must be identical to the targets established for the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) Highway Safety Grants program that is administered by OTS. The State Departments of Transportation (DOTs) must also coordinate with their Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) in their states on establishment of targets, to the maximum extent practicable. States will report targets to the FHWA in the HSIP report due in August of each year.

Each MPO will establish targets for the same five safety performance measures for all public roads in the MPO's planning area within 180 days after the state establishes each target. The targets will be established in coordination with the state, to the maximum extent practicable. The MPO can either agree to support the State DOT target or establish a numerical target specific to the MPO planning area. MPOs' targets are reported to the State DOT, which must be able to provide the targets to FHWA, upon requestⁱⁱⁱ.

How the FTIP Makes Progress Toward PM1

SBCAG has designed the FTIP so that it will make progress toward achieving the federal transportation performance target for safety. SBCAG along with all project sponsors, like Caltrans and transit operators have selected projects for funding that advance the region's goals.

Many of the projects programmed in the FTIP serve to improve transportation safety to some extent. For some projects, safety is the primary objective, and for others, safety may be a single component of a more expansive scope.

Three statewide funding programs dedicated to transportation safety are employed by SBCAG including:

1. Active Transportation Program (ATP)
2. Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP)
3. State Highway Operations & Protection Program (SHOPP) Collision Reduction

ATP

The ATP provides funding for bicycle and pedestrian projects. Since people are more vulnerable to safety risk while walking or biking as compared to traveling in a motor vehicle, any project that promotes the safe use of bicycling or pedestrian modes is likely to generate safety benefits. The ATP further emphasizes safety by allotting points for project applications that specifically seek to reduce the rate or number of pedestrian and bicyclist fatalities and injuries.

HSIP

The HSIP directly addresses transportation safety. The program's stated purpose is to "achieve a significant reduction in traffic fatalities and serious injuries on all public roads, including non-State-owned public roads and roads on tribal land." Successful project applications specifically seek to reduce collision related fatalities and injuries. The program is designed to focus local

investments to locations and corridors that demonstrate the greatest need for safety improvement to implement lower cost countermeasures.

SHOPP Collision Reduction

SHOPP is the State Highway System's "fix-it-first" program that funds roadway repairs and preservation, emergency repairs, safety improvements, and some highway operational improvements on the State Highway System (SHS). SHOPP funding is limited to capital improvement projects that do not add new roadway capacity (no new highway lanes) to the SHS, though some new auxiliary lanes may be eligible for SHOPP funding.

The Collision Reduction program is one of eight categories that make up the SHOPP, and its objective is to reduce the number or severity of collisions. The SHOPP Collision Reduction category consists of two sub-programs:

- *201.010 - Safety Improvements*: Reactive approach based on analysis of collision history
- *201.015 - Collision Severity Reduction*: Proactive approach targeted to reduce the potential for traffic collisions based on past performance of roadway characteristics
- *201.112 – Bridge Rail Replacement and Upgrade*
- *201.235 – Roadside Safety Improvements*

201.010 – Safety Improvements

The SHOPP Collision Reduction Safety Improvements sub-program is designed to reduce the number or severity of collisions on the SHS. Projects with a safety index above 200 qualify as a safety improvement project. Projects may be individual locations where the collision history indicates a pattern potentially correctable by a targeted safety improvement, such as unsafe traffic (school zone signals included), wet pavement corrections, curve corrections, shoulder widening, left-turn channelization, etc. All proposed projects will be verified by the Caltrans Office of Traffic Safety Programs in the Division of Traffic Operations before being certified as a safety improvement project.

This program also provides funding for safety improvements at sites identified in regional monitoring programs for the reduction of motor vehicle collisions, such as locations at high risk for wrong-way, multilane, cross-median, cross-centerline, and run-off-the-road collisions. The program also provides funding for non-motorized safety improvements, such as pedestrian and bicycle facilities.

The Safety Improvements program does not provide funding for relocating existing highways or projects that would add new through lanes or upgrade existing highways to a higher classification,

such as conventional to expressway, regardless of the safety benefits. This program also does not include projects where the prime purpose is reducing congestion.

Highway improvement projects along an existing alignment to improve standards of width, grade, alignment, or other geometric improvements, are considered new highway construction and are included in the Caltrans STIP programs.

201.015 - Collision Severity Reduction

This sub-program is focused on upgrading existing highway safety features within the roadbed's clear recovery area to reduce the number and severity of collisions. Eligible projects may include new guardrail end treatments and crash cushions, rumble strips, glare screen, rock fall mitigation, overcrossing pedestrian fencing, crosswalk safety enhancements, and improvements that prevent roadway departure.

The Collision Severity Reduction program is designed to be proactive in enhancing safety on the State Highway System. As such, this program is not subject to a safety index analysis but will define projected collision severity reduction performance quantitatively. Projects will be prioritized based on the projected collision severity reduction benefits provided.

201.112 – Bridge Rail Replacement and Upgrade

This sub-program is focused on bringing all non-crashworthy bridge rails up to current Federal standards. The program will identify the number and locations of non-crashworthy rails and develop an implementation plan to bring these rails to the current standards. Bridge rail upgrades will not be covered by this program when they are part of any bridge rehabilitation or replacement initiated by any other action or need. Those upgrades are to be covered by the initiating program.

201.235 – Roadside Safety Improvements

This sub-program is focused on reducing roadside worker fatalities to zero and reducing employee injury rates by minimizing the frequency and duration of highway workers' exposure to traffic. Roadside Safety Improvements are an effective means to improve worker safety and reduce fatality and injury rates as determined by site specific factors. Improving highway worker safety also improves safety for travelers on the SHS by reducing collision hazards.

Roadside safety is required to be addressed, and roadside safety improvements are to be included on all SHS roadway improvement projects. Roadside Safety Improvement Projects should be programmed to address deficiencies at locations where no roadway projects are planned. This program element is not to be used for Roadside Safety Improvements included as part of a roadway improvement project.

2026 SHOPP Collision Reduction Numbers (Statewide)

A total of 593 projects are included in the 2026 SHOPP. The 2026 SHOPP is valued at \$17.86 billion, which includes reservation amounts for several programs, including the Collision Reduction Program. The SHOPP Collision Reduction Program currently has 103 programmed safety projects totaling \$1.6 billion. The SHOPP reserves \$435 million for the 201.010 Safety

Improvement program. The reserved amount will address future safety improvements as they are identified.

SBCAG's funding programs also address safety. SBCAG's Measure A Regional Bicycle and Pedestrian, and Safe Routes to School Programs is divided into two programs, one in the South Coast and one in North County. The South Coast program issues a call for projects every 3 years and the North County every 4 years. The programs consider safety as a scoring criterion when projects and programs are evaluated for funding through the competitive process.

Safety is at the forefront in SBCAG's planning efforts. For instance, SBCAG recently completed the Santa Ynez Valley Traffic Circulation and Safety Study which comprehensively looked at safety concerns in the Santa Ynez Valley. SBCAG, through its local sales tax measure provides funding for hard and soft safety improvements along the CA Highway 166 corridor in northern Santa Barbara County. Finally, SBCAG created a Highway 154 Safety Task Force to discuss safety improvements along the Highway 154 corridor in central Santa Barbara County.

SBCAG does not have a singular safety plan, rather, SBCAG considers safety in all of its planning efforts, including the regional transportation plan, corridor and area plans, as well as active transportation plans.

Safety Project Highlights

An example of an HSIP project is H12-05-015 from the County of Santa Barbara. This project will upgrade existing Metal Beam Guardrail (MBGR) to Midwest Guardrail System (MGS). (**Appendix 6**)

A significant Active Transportation Program (ATP) project is Modoc Road Multimodal Path Gap Closure project (MPO ID: COUNTY33), which will construct 1.1 miles of Class I (multi-use) path along Modoc Road for bicyclists, runners and pedestrians of all ages and abilities. This project is part of a much larger transformative project that crosses the Santa Barbara County/City line and connects to the City of Santa Barbara's ATP Cycle 3 project, Las Positas/Modoc Road Multiuse Path Project, which is now complete. See picture below showing completed project.

National Highway System (NHS) Pavement & Bridge Condition (PM 2)

Caltrans developed a performance target analysis tool (PTAT) as part of the statewide Transportation Asset Management Plan (TAMP). The tool was created to establish agency-specific long-term 10-year and short-term 4-year TAMP targets for pavement and bridge assets on the NHS.

Below are the current conditions and targets for highway system pavement and bridge condition in the SBCAG region. The FHWA categorizes highways into 'Interstate' and 'non-Interstate'. The SBCAG region does not have Interstate highways, therefore those targets are not included in the tables below.

The majority of the National Highway System in Santa Barbara County is owned and operated by Caltrans.

*Current conditions for pavement are from the June 2021 Highway Performance Management System (HPMS) data which are based on the latest 2020 APCS inspection. Bridge conditions are based on the latest 2021 National Bridge Inventory (NBI) data.

The target setting process for NHS pavement and bridges began in California with a target setting workshop held in 2017 for the development of the first TAMP that established 10-year expected condition performance targets. For this initial target setting process, state and regional transportation agencies used an approach that considered their available resources for the NHS and the extent of the NHS each agency owned. Caltrans presented a few different options for establishing targets, but most local transportation agencies own less than two percent of NHS pavements and less than half a percent of NHS bridge deck area, so MPOs and Regional Transportation Planning Agencies (RTPA)s unanimously elected to adopt a statewide weighted average NHS performance target for pavement and bridges.

In May of 2018, Caltrans established 2- and 4-year performance targets as required by federal performance management rules and received documentation from all MPOs that they would support the statewide targets as well as agreed to plan and program projects so they contribute toward established goals. As recently as October 2020, Caltrans reported separately to FHWA on progress made towards performance targets for the midperformance reporting period. Caltrans and MPOs have subsequently revisited the performance targets set 4 years ago as part of the 2022 TAMP development process. Caltrans held a virtual workshop in July 2021 that focused on investment strategies and performance targets.

A new performance target analysis tool (PTAT) developed for the TAMP was presented at the workshop. The PTAT was customized for each MPO that included their starting inventory and condition of NHS pavement and bridges and investments in the 5 federal work types (i.e. initial construction, maintenance, preservation, rehabilitation, and reconstruction) estimated by Caltrans as part of a financial planning workshop.

Many of the projects programmed in the FTIP serve to improve or maintain pavement and bridge condition.

Additionally, more information on performance measures is included in Chapter 2 of SBCAG's 2050 RTP/SCS, Connected 2050.^{iv}

How the FTIP Makes Progress Toward PM2

The following section describes the funding sources and programs that have been used to fund PM 2 related projects in the SBCAG region. Many of the projects programmed in the FTIP serve to improve or maintain pavement and bridge conditions.

Local Funds

Cities and counties spend billions of dollars each year maintaining local roads and bridges. Funding for these efforts is derived from a myriad of sources. In a survey of California jurisdictions, for local funds alone, there are more than a hundred different sources of taxes and fees reported that are used on pavement improvement projects.^v Some examples of local funding sources include:

- Local sales taxes
- Development impact fees
- General funds

- Various assessment districts – lighting, maintenance, flood control, special assessments, community facility districts
- Traffic impact fees
- Traffic safety/circulation fees
- Utilities (e.g., stormwater, water, wastewater enterprise funds)
- Transportation mitigation fees
- Parking and various permit fees
- Flood control districts
- Enterprise funds (solid waste and water)
- Investment earnings
- Parcel/property taxes
- Indian reservation roads
- Indian gaming funds
- Vehicle registration fees
- Vehicle code fines
- Underground impact fees
- Transient occupancy taxes
- Capital Improvement Program (CIP) reserves/capital funds

Local Funds are typically used for non-regionally significant road maintenance, safety, and bridge projects. Even so, some of the PM 2 projects in the FTIP are funded through Local Funds.

State Funds

HUTA

The Highway Users Tax Account (HUTA), more commonly known as the state gas tax, is still the single largest funding source for cities and counties.

SB 1

California doubled down on PM 2 when it approved Senate Bill 1 on April 28, 2017. SB 1 increased several taxes and fees to raise more than \$5 billion annually in new transportation revenues. Moreover, SB 1 provides for inflationary adjustments, so that purchasing power does not diminish as it has in the past. SB 1 prioritizes funding towards maintenance, rehabilitation, and safety improvements on state highways, local streets and roads, and bridges and to improve the state's trade corridors, transit, and active transportation facilities.

Many SB 1 funds are not captured in the FTIP because this document focuses on federally funded and regionally significant projects, while SB 1 is a non-federal fund source that tends to pay for non-regionally significant road maintenance, safety, and bridge projects. Even so, some of the PM 2 projects in the FTIP are funded through SB 1.

Federal Funds

HBP

The Highway Bridge Program (HBP) provides federal aid to local agencies to replace and rehabilitate deficient, locally owned, public highway bridges. The HBP is intended to remove structural deficiencies, the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) revises the terminology to

“classified in poor condition,” from existing local highway bridges to keep the traveling public safe. The HBP provides about \$288 million annually for bridge projects. Off-system bridges are usually funded at 100% HBP, while on system bridges are funded at 88.53% HBP. An exception to the federal participating rate is “high-cost” bridges, in which sponsors enter into agreements with Caltrans Local Assistance and agree on a federal participating rate which may not equal 100% or 88.53%.

BFP

Bridge Formula Program (BFP) is a new program established under the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) to provide funding to replace, rehabilitate, preserve, protect, and construct bridges. It is a complement to the discretionary Bridge Investment Program (see below). The Bridge Formula Program under BIL provides 4.25 Billion to the State of California, of which States are required to reserve 15 percent of their formula funds under this program for use on off-system bridges. For funds used on locally owned off-system bridges, the Federal share is 100%.

SHOPP

The SHOPP was described in the section above under PM 1. Two of the eight categories of the SHOPP that address PM 2 are Bridge Preservation and Roadway Preservation.

Although the SHOPP is a program, it is often thought of as a fund source as well. The FTIP lists the fund source for most SHOPP projects as “SHOPP Advance Construction.” Caltrans blends funds from HUTA, SB 1, and federal highway funds into SHOPP, and the “SHOPP Advance Construction” designation serves as a placeholder for what may be federal or state funds.

SHOPP Roadway Preservation

The SHOPP Roadway Preservation category includes the following programs:

- 201.120 – Roadway Rehabilitation
- 201.121 – Pavement Preservation
- 201.122 – Pavement Rehabilitation
- 201.151 – Drainage System Restoration
- 201.170 – Signs and Lighting Rehabilitation

The 2026 SHOPP has 264 Roadway Preservation projects totaling \$10 billion which includes future need/contingency dollars. The SHOPP does not have a reservation for Roadway Preservation.

SHOPP Bridge Preservation

The SHOPP Bridge Preservation category includes the following programs:

- 201.110 – Bridge Rehabilitation and Replacement
- 201.111 – Bridge Scour Mitigation
- 201.113 – Bridge Seismic Restoration
- 201.114 – Bridge Widening
- 201.116 – Bridge Formula Program
- 201.119 – Capital Bridge Preventative Maintenance Program
- 201.322 – Transportation Permit Requirements for Bridges

The 2024 SHOPP has 82 Bridge Preservation projects totaling \$2,362,120,000 which includes future need/contingency dollars. The SHOPP does not have a reservation for Bridge Preservation.

Pavement and Bridge Condition Project Highlights

Some key projects that are contributing towards PM2 are below, these projects make progress towards PM2 by rehabilitating pavement or rehabilitating/replacing bridges:

- SHOPP Roadway Preservation (SHOPP1) project, In and near Solvang, from Alamo Pintado Road to Entrance Road. Replace bridge, construct Class 1 bike and pedestrian

paths, and upgrade facilities to Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards. (EA: 1M420).

- Highway Bridge Program: Bridge No. 00L0047, FOOTHILL ROAD OVER CUYAMA RIVER. Construct new 2-lane bridge to replace existing 2-lane low-water crossing

NHS Performance, Interstate System Freight Movement, and CMAQ Program Performance (PM 3)

On May 20, 2017, a Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) final rule took effect, with the exception of certain portions of the rule. The rule, published in the Federal Register (82 FR 5970) on January 18, 2017, establishes performance measures as required by the Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (MAP-21) and the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act. The measures in this final rule will be used by State Departments of Transportation (State DOTs) and Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) to assess the performance of the Interstate and non-Interstate National Highway System (NHS) for the purpose of carrying out the National Highway Performance Program (NHPP); to assess freight movement on the Interstate System; and to assess traffic congestion and on-road mobile source emissions for the purpose of carrying out the Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement (CMAQ) Program. This final rule is one of several rulemakings to implement MAP-21's new performance management framework. The collective rulemakings will establish the regulations needed to more effectively evaluate and report on surface transportation performance across the Nation.

Moreover, the rule requires State DOTs to submit a Baseline Performance Period Report to FHWA by October 1st of the first year in a performance period. (23 CFR §490.107.) State DOTs shall submit their first Baseline Performance Period Report to FHWA by October 1, 2018, and subsequent Baseline Performance Period Reports to FHWA by October 1st every 4 years thereafter. For the second performance period (1/1/2022 – 12/31/2025), due to unforeseen circumstances with FHWA's web-based Performance Management Form (PMF) reporting system, State DOTs received an extension to establish their targets by December 16, 2022. The MPOs shall establish targets no later than 180 days after the respective State DOT(s) establishes their targets (June 16, 2023) by either: 1) Agreeing to plan and program projects so that they contribute toward the accomplishment of the State DOT system performance target for each

respective performance measure; or 2) Committing to a quantifiable target for each respective performance measure for their metropolitan planning area.

In 2023 SBCAG elected to support the State DOT targets for performance period 2022-2025 (option 1 above) and the table below indicates the Performance Measure 3 targets and metrics. Caltrans and the MPOs are currently in the process of collaborating on the cycle 3 PM3 targets for the performance period 2025-2028.

Performance Measure 3 has six different metrics to address system reliability, freight, and congestion. Of those six metrics, three are applicable in Santa Barbara County. The interstate system does not pass through Santa Barbara County and therefore the associated performance measures are not applicable. Santa Barbara County is not a designated non-attainment area and does not receive Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement (CMAQ) Program funding. Following the 2020 Census, the Santa Barbara Urbanized Area reached a population greater than 200,000. For this reason, the performance measures for annual hours of peak-hour excessive delay per capita, and percent of non-single occupancy vehicle (SOV) travel, now apply.

For the metric of *percent of reliable person-miles travelled on the non-interstate National Highway System*, the 2-year target is a 0.5% increase, and the 4-year target is a 1% increase from the 2022 baseline data.

How the FTIP Makes Progress Toward PM3

Many of the projects programmed in the FTIP serve to improve NHS performance, interstate freight movement, and CMAQ program performance.

The following are funding sources and programs that help fund Non-Interstate and Interstate improvement projects:

SHOPP Mobility

The SHOPP Mobility category includes following three programs:

201.310 – Operational Improvements

201.315 – Transportation Management Systems

201.321 – Commercial Vehicle Enforcement Facilities & Weigh-In-Motion Scales

201.310 – Operational Improvements

The primary purpose of this program element is to improve traffic flow on existing State highways by reducing congestion and operational deficiencies at spot locations. Operational improvement projects do not expand the design capacity of the system.

Examples of Operational Improvements projects include, but are not limited to:

- Interchange modifications (not to accommodate traffic volumes significantly larger than what the existing facilities were designed for)
- Ramp modifications (acceleration – deceleration/weaving)
- Auxiliary lanes for merging or weaving between adjacent interchanges
- Curve corrections/improve alignment
- Signals and/or intersection improvements
- Two-way left-turn lanes
- Channelization
- Turnouts
- Shoulder widening
- HOV Degradation Mitigation
- TSMO

201.315 – Transportation Management Systems

The primary purpose of this program element is to improve traffic flow on existing State highways by addressing system-wide congestion through system management techniques. Transportation Management Systems reduce highway user delays, enable optimization of traffic flow, provide traveler information and safety alerts, collect information on traffic behavior, and contribute to the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions. These systems provide State highway system status information for system operators, system planners, and travelers.

Examples of Transportation Management System projects include, but are not limited to:

- Traffic signals
- Changeable message signs
- Close circuit television cameras
- Freeway ramp meters
- Traffic monitoring detection stations
- Communications systems
- Highway advisory radio
- Traffic signal interconnect projects
- Traffic management systems housed in Transportation Management Centers (TMCs), including the necessary software and hardware (excluding facilities)

201.321 – Weigh Stations & Weigh-in-Motion Facilities

The primary purpose of this program element is to provide for Commercial Vehicle Enforcement Facilities (commonly called Weigh Stations) and Weigh-in-Motion (WIM) systems. Weigh Stations are needed to support the Commercial Vehicle Enforcement Plan; Truck safety, size and weight regulations are enforced by the California Highway Patrol, reducing truck related accidents or incidents and protecting our highways from premature damage. The WIM sites provide data for federally mandated data systems and special studies, design and maintenance strategies, size and weight policies, enforcement and planning strategies, and the traffic and truck volumes publications. WIM systems are integral to the CVEF bypass program which is a public/private partnership that prescreens commercial trucks, reducing congestion at weigh stations and promotes freight mobility.

The 2026 SHOPP features 27 Mobility projects programmed totaling \$674.3 million which includes future need/contingency dollars. The SHOPP does not have a reservation for Mobility.

SB 1 Trade Corridor Enhancement Program (Including National Highway Freight Program)

The purpose of the Senate Bill 1 (SB 1) Trade Corridor Enhancement Program (TCEP) is to provide funding for infrastructure improvements on federally designated Trade Corridors of National and Regional Significance, on California's portion of the National Highway Freight Network as identified in California Freight Mobility Plan, and along other corridors that experience high volumes of freight movement. The Trade Corridor Enhancement Program also supports the goals of the National Highway Freight Program, the California Freight Mobility Plan, and the guiding principles in the California Sustainable Freight Action Plan.

This statewide, competitive program will provide approximately \$300 million per year in state funding and approximately \$135 million in National Highway Freight Program (NHFP) funds. The NHFP is authorized under the IIJA through FFY 2026.

Eligible applicants apply for program funds through the nomination of projects. All projects nominated must be identified in a currently adopted regional transportation plan (RTP). The Commission is required to evaluate and select submitted applications based on the following criteria:

- Freight System Factors – Throughput, Velocity, and Reliability

- Transportation System Factors – Safety, Congestion Reduction/Mitigation, Key Transportation Bottleneck Relief, Multi-Modal Strategy, Interregional Benefits, and Advanced Technology
- Community Impact Factors – Air Quality Impact, Community Impact Mitigation, and Economic/Jobs Growth
- The overall need, benefits, and cost of the project
- Project Readiness – ability to complete the project in a timely manner
- Demonstration of the required 30% matching funds
- The leveraging and coordination of funds from multiple sources
- Jointly nominated and/or jointly funded

Truck Travel Discussion

All mobility on freeways helps truck travel, but some projects are primarily or are particularly helpful for trucking like auxiliary lanes, truck climbing lanes, improvements on farm to market routes. Other projects are primarily freight such as truck pull over areas and freight studies.

CMAQ

The Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) program supports improving air quality and relieving roadway congestion. The purpose of the CMAQ program is to fund transportation projects or programs that will contribute to attainment or maintenance of the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) for ozone, carbon monoxide (CO), and particulate matter (both PM10 and PM2.5).

SBCAG is in air quality attainment and does not receive CMAQ funds.

PM 3 Project Highlights

Currently SBCAG doesn't have a project with funding in the four-year FTIP period that is making progress towards achieving PM 3 target. The Santa Barbara U.S. 101 Multimodal Corridor Project - 4E North (MPO ID: CT132) is designated as a Critical Urban Freight Corridor by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA). This project serves to improve NHS performance and interstate freight movement.

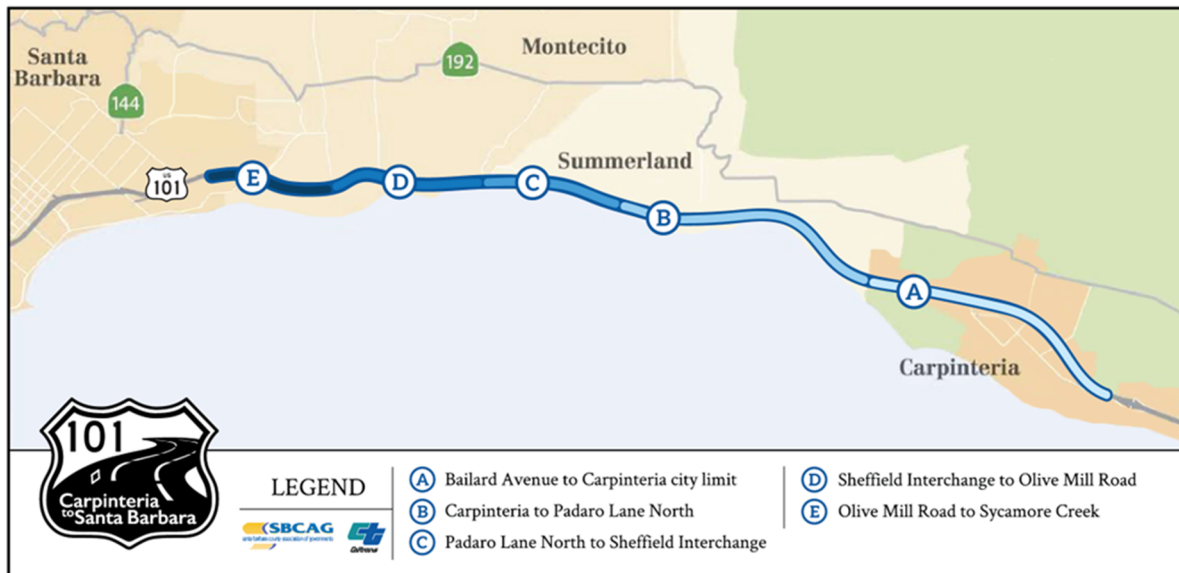


Figure 3 South Coast 101 HOV Carpinteria (Segment 4A-4E)

The TAM targets provided below were produced collaboratively with transit agencies based on their agency TAM plans and local targets. In developing the targets, SBCAG reviewed and considered the various local and regional transit operators' TAM plans (including identified goals, objectives, measures, and targets), thereby incorporating them into the metropolitan planning process.

This section presents the TAM performance measures and targets adopted by Transit Operators in the SBCAG region.

The six public transportation reporting entities provided their targets to SBCAG as shown in Table 9 above. Not all transit agencies in the SBCAG region are required to have TAM plans as they are not Chapter 53 recipients. The SBCAG regional targets are presented in tabular form to account for the differences in targets and standards among the providers of public transportation. Targets represent the thresholds for the maximum percentage of assets at or exceeding acceptable standards. In most cases for the target-setting process, providers set targets that were approximately equivalent to their current performance. In future years, staff will work with the providers of public transportation to collate performance.

SBCAG will continue to work with the region's transit operators and county transportation commissions to seek ways to improve the methodology, data collection, and analysis for future RTP updates, and to continue engaging in a regional discussion about transit state of good repair and the need for additional funding.

How the FTIP Makes Progress Toward TAM targets

Transit Operators in the SBCAG region have developed and adopted TAM plans and targets, which are available from the transit agencies. TAM category projects may also be supported by state, local, and other federal funding sources (e.g., FTA Section 5337 State of Good Repair, FTA 5307, FTA 5339 formula funds, and FHWA flexible funds such as CMAQ and STBG). The funding and the program of projects in the FTIP will enable the Transit Operators to achieve their respective transit asset management performance targets.

There are 26 projects in the 2027 FTIP with \$55.1 million in FTA funds and \$22.7 million in local funds that support the maintenance or replacement of transit assets.

Transit Asset Management Project Highlights

The FTIP includes funding from multiple FTA sources for projects that support TAM and maintaining a state of good repair. Examples of these projects include rural and urban capital assistance programs, rolling stock acquisition, maintenance, and overhauls, bus fleet rehabilitation and replacement, track and rail yard maintenance and improvements and maintenance of passenger facilities. For the SBCAG region key projects that address TAM include:

- MTD Facility Improvements (MPO ID: MTD18)
- Bus Procurement for SMRT using 5307 funds (MPO ID: SM64)
- City of Lompoc Bus purchase (MPO ID: LOMPOC25)

Public Transportation Agency Safety Plans (PTASP)

Transit safety targets must be set every four years and be included in the SBCAG Regional Transportation Plan (RTP). The goals, objectives, performance measures, and targets from the transit providers' safety plans must also be integrated into the RTP, either directly or by reference.

The National Public Transportation Safety Plan identifies four performance measures that must be included: fatalities, injuries, safety events, and system reliability. Definitions for transit safety performance measures are as described in the NTD Safety and Security Manual.

Transit providers may choose to establish additional targets for safety performance monitoring and measurement. The following table documents existing performance targets set by transit operators in the SBCAG region.

How the FTIP Makes Progress Toward PTASP targets

Each transit agency is required to make its transit safety performance targets available to MPOs to assist in the planning process, and coordinate, to the maximum extent practicable, with the MPO in selecting regional safety targets. More detailed information regarding targets from the transit agencies can be found for Santa Barbara MTD. Santa Barbara MTD's Public Transportation Agency Safety Plan can be found [here](#).

The planning strategies included in the RTP and other performance-based plans translate into project selection criteria in performance-based programming. Agencies use the project selection criteria to allocate resources to specific projects and programs to achieve strategic goals, objectives, and performance targets. The result is a cyclical process of planning and programming which is informed with data and adjusted over time based on system performance.

There are 4 projects in the 2027 FTIP with approximately \$43 million in §5307 funding that specify the maintenance or replacement of transit assets.

Transit Safety Project Highlights

The FTIP includes funding from multiple FTA sources for projects that support transit safety. Examples of these projects include bus replacement, bus pullouts, bulb-outs, bus stop improvements, light rail crossing improvements, train control, grade separations. For the SBCAG region, key projects that address transit safety include:

- Transit Fleet Security Updates (MPO ID: LOMPOC26)
- Solvang Bus Stop Bench Replacement (MPO ID: SOLVANG04)

CHAPTER TWO - Financial Plan & Financial Constraint

Introduction and Purpose

As a programming document, the FTIP is required to be financially constrained – programmed expenditures must be balanced with specified revenues. Transportation projects scheduled over the next four fiscal years (the “quadrennial period”) that will receive federal funding must be identified. Projects anticipated beyond the quadrennial period are included for information purposes. Only projects with dedicated funding source(s) are allowed in the first fiscal year, and projects in the second, third and fourth years must be carefully reviewed to ensure that there is either a firm funding commitment, or a reasonable expectation that funds will be available.

The Need for Financial Plans and Financial Constraint

A financial plan is the mechanism for demonstrating financial constraint in the metropolitan planning process. Financial constraint is a demonstration that there will be sufficient funds to implement proposed improvements, and to operate and maintain the entire system, by comparing costs with available financial resources. The federal agencies are responsible for making a financial constraint determination on the federally required FSTIP, with states and MPOs being called on to demonstrate such fiscal constraint.

In short, federal rulemaking states that RTPs and FTIPs must include a financial plan. MPOs must demonstrate, and FHWA and FTA must determine financial constraint, in the metropolitan planning process, all relying heavily on the MPO’s required financial plans.

The 2027 FTIP

This 2027 FTIP updates the previous FTIP adopted in September 19, 2024; it integrates new and modified projects which initially took form as amendments to the 2025 FTIP. Also, new data for the 2026 SHOPP and adopted 2026 STIP programs are included in the FTIP.

Year of Expenditure Dollars for Project Cost Estimates

Project costs are presented in year of expenditure (YOE) dollars, assuming a cost inflation rate.

- Cost estimates are identified in year of expenditure dollars.
 - Construction costs for projects in the FTIP are assumed to increase between 0 and 3.75% annually. STIP funded projects represent a significant portion of the projects and are already inflated.
 - Operating expenses for Guadalupe Transit, COLT, SMAT, SYVT, and SBMTD were taken from the TDA Triennial Performance Audit Reports with a base year of FY 2005-06 and are assumed to increase by 3% annually, the rate used in the North Santa Barbara County Transit Plan.

System Preservation, Operation, and Maintenance Costs

The operation and maintenance of the existing transportation system in Santa Barbara County is a top priority for SBCAG. Santa Barbara County’s transportation system includes an extensive network of local roadways, bridges, state highways, and passenger rail and bus transit. Multiple federal, state and local fund sources are utilized to operate and maintain the transportation system.

Based on the most recent California State Controller Local Streets and Roads Reports (FY 2024–25), Santa Barbara County and its incorporated cities continue to invest tens of millions of dollars annually in the maintenance and reconstruction of the region's more than 3,000 lane miles of local roads.

The California Statewide Local Streets and Roads Needs Assessment (Assessment) is a biannual report that details the conditions of the streets and roads in the state. The assessment ranks road conditions using a Pavement Condition Index (PCI) with values of zero (failed condition) to 100 (good to excellent condition). The latest update in 2023 ranks the average condition of the state's local streets and roads in the “at risk” category with a score of 65. The table below, PCI and Needs by County, shows the PCI scores, number of lane miles, and total 10-year maintenance and rehabilitation need as identified in the Assessment for the SBCAG region. The total need for the region equates to roughly over \$108 million annually over the next 10 years.

Funds that local agencies rely on for this shortfall for local roadway, bridge and state highway projects are federal Surface Transportation Program, federal Highway Bridge Program, local revenues, and the county transportation sales tax, Measure A.

Transit operations, maintenance, and capital needs of the existing transit system in Santa Barbara County includes operating assistance to transit operators, vehicle maintenance, vehicle replacement, bus purchases and safety/facility improvements for bus transit. Transit operations and maintenance is the responsibility of the individual transit operators. Funding for transit operations and maintenance in the 2027 FTIP is primarily provided through five programs: FTA 5307, FTA 5311, FTA 5310, FTA 5339, and Local Funds. In the 2027 FTIP period a total of \$130.4 million is identified in these revenues to support transit operations and maintenance – this total is expected to meet most of the operations and maintenance needs of all transit operators in the region.

Any shortfall for possible transit system needs is met using local funds. Local Measure A funds help fund interregional transit like the Clean Air Express and Coastal Express, each receive an estimated annual amount of \$1 million for the life of the Measure. Measure A also provides around \$1.3 million a year to SB MTD for transit capital and \$2.7 million a year for transit operations in the South Coast. Lastly, specialized transit for elderly and disabled also receives approximately \$500,000 in Measure A funds for specialized transit operators such as: Easy Lift, Lompoc Valley, Guadalupe Transit, Santa Maria Regional Transit (SMRT), Santa Maria Organization of Transportation Helpers (SMOOTH), and Santa Ynez Valley Transit (SYVT). Some of these transit projects do not have federal funds so they are not shown in the 2027 FTIP.

Local jurisdictions and transit operators also utilize additional state and local funding sources for maintaining their transportation systems that are not all included in the 2027 FTIP.

The new federal transportation bill, the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA), also includes increased funding for repairing and maintaining bridges, transit systems, and other infrastructure.

Financial Uncertainties

This FTIP is based on reasonably anticipated revenues sources. However, it is important to note that events such as switching transportation funds to general fund purposes (such as vehicle weight fees) can shift funding away from transportation unexpectedly. And some fund sources are naturally more volatile (such as the gas tax, which relies on the price and sales of gasoline). Federal appropriations are conducted annually as is California's annual budget. As such, the figures represent the best available information as of June 2020.

It is important to note that the FTIP is a living document that can be amended at any time. This flexibility is essential for the ability to deliver projects in a timely manner or to modify projects as necessary and to keep the public informed of these actions.

Further, the FTIP is a programming document – it is useful in keeping the public informed of where federal public transportation dollars are being expended in their areas, and not an accounting document that focuses on precise dollar amounts.

Financial Constraint Determination

The estimated revenue from all sources over the four year period FY 26/27 to FY 29/30 included in the FTIP is approximately \$677 million. As the tables included in Appendix 1 indicate, the revenues over the period, including the quadrennial element FY 26/27 to FY 29/30, are sufficient to implement proposed improvements in the FTIP, and operate and maintain the transportation system in the county.

The 2027 FTIP programs transportation funding from a wide variety of sources. Several of the major sources from which funds are programmed are:

- State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) including:
 - Street and highway projects
 - Intercity passenger rail
 - Project planning, programming and monitoring
- Regional Surface Transportation Program (RSTP)
- Federal Transit including:
 - FTA Section 5307 – Urbanized Area Program
 - FTA Section 5310 – Elderly and Disabled Program
 - FTA Section 5311 – Rural and Small Urban Area Program
 - FTA Section 5311f – Rural Transit & Intercity Bus Program
 - FTA Section 5339 – Bus & Bus Facilities Program
- Other federal programs including High Priority (Demonstration) Projects
- State Highway Operation and Protection Program (SHOPP)
 - State Grouped Projects Program (i.e., aggregated program amounts rather than individual projects) including: State minor projects
- Local Highway Bridge Program (HBP)
- Active Transportation Program (ATP)
- Highway Maintenance (HM)
- Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP)

- Recreational Trails Program
- Measure A local transportation sales tax and other locally-collected funds (such as development mitigation fees).

CHAPTER 3 – FTIP Project Listings by Agency

Overview

SBCAG is required to adopt a Federal Transportation Improvement Program identifying transportation projects proposed for implementation using federal funds as well as regionally significant projects which were funded by other sources (such as Measure A) for the upcoming four-year period. This 2027 FTIP updates the previous FTIP adopted in December 2024. It integrates new and modified projects which initially took form as amendments to the 2025 FTIP, and, perhaps most significantly, it incorporates the major fund changes brought about through the 2026 STIP and 2026 SHOPP.

Most of the projects in the 2027 FTIP are carried over from the 2025 FTIP. To decide which projects to carryover, SBCAG asked project sponsors of projects in the 20235 FTIP to indicate which of their projects had been completed, were well underway or were still in planning or early implementation stages. During the preliminary review of the draft FTIP, project sponsors also were allowed to propose new projects to be included in the 2027 FTIP.

By replacing federal funding in many local projects through the STIP, local agencies have been relieved of many procedures and regulations more appropriate for large-scale projects. The major benefit of this procedural relief is that the unexpended time, effort and money can be redirected to developing and implementing their projects more effectively (the federal funds now go to Caltrans' state highways operations and maintenance programs, the SHOPP).

This chapter includes a comprehensive listing of the region's highway, local street, transit, bikeway, bridge and other projects be funded under the federal FAST Act transportation legislation, with updated information on each project's scope, lead agency, cost, schedule and funding sources. A project must be included in the FTIP, which has been approved by SBCAG, Caltrans and the Federal DOT, as a prerequisite to receiving federal funding.

Each printout includes a summary of the transportation project with the source of each fund by fiscal year. Most of the following project information sheets have been produced using California Transportation Improvement Program System (CTIPS) FTIP Management Database. The projects in the 2027 FTIP will be implemented by the local cities and the county, the transit districts, SBCAG, Caltrans and other public and private agencies that maintain, operate, improve and expand the transportation system in the Santa Barbara County region.

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Section I. PURPOSE AND BACKGROUND

The Santa Barbara County Association of Governments (SBCAG), in its capacity as the designated Metropolitan Planning Organization and Regional Transportation Planning Agency for Santa Barbara County, is responsible under federal and State law for developing transportation plans and programs for the region, and for doing so through a “continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive” planning process, carried out in cooperation with other State, regional and local agencies.

SBCAG was established (originally as the Santa Barbara County-Cities Area Planning Council) on October 26, 1966 upon execution of a Joint Powers Agreement by the Cities of Carpinteria, Guadalupe, Lompoc, Santa Barbara, Santa Maria, and the County of Santa Barbara. Authority for creation of SBCAG is contained in Sections 65600-65604 of the California Government Code. The Cities of Solvang, Buellton and Goleta joined SBCAG upon their incorporation in 1985, 1992 and 2002, respectively.

The governing Board of SBCAG consists of the five members of the County Board of Supervisors plus one City Council representative from each of the eight cities within the county.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Santa Barbara County Association of Governments’ Public Participation Plan is to inform and involve citizens in SBCAG’s various programs, projects and work activities. This includes, but is not limited to, residents of Santa Barbara County, lower income households, minorities, persons with disabilities, representatives from community and service organizations, tribal councils, and other public agencies. This element also assists in identifying and addressing environmental justice and social equity issues. Citizen participation objectives include involvement of interested citizens, stakeholders and representatives of community organizations in agency work through timely workshops on topical issues, fully noticed public hearings, and ongoing broad citizen/organization involvement in the planning and decision processes.

Broad-based community participation is essential to the success of programs, plans and projects of the Santa Barbara County Association of Governments. Ideals for public participation include:

- Value public participation and promote broad-based involvement by members of the community;
- Provide varied opportunities for public review and input;
- Treat all members of the public fairly, and respect and consider all citizen input as an important component of the planning implementation process;
- Promote a culture of dialogue and partnership among residents, property owners, the business and environmental communities, organizations, other interested citizens, and public officials;
- Use existing community groups and other organizations, as feasible;
- Encourage active public participation at the initial stages of the process, as well as throughout the process;
- Provide communications and agency reports that are clear, timely, and broadly distributed; and

- Outreach to groups that may be underserved by existing transportation systems or who may be disproportionately impacted by transportation projects.

BACKGROUND

In an effort to reach out to the people of Santa Barbara County and in response to the passage of the 1991 Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act (ISTEA), the Santa Barbara County Association of Governments in 1992 developed a Public Participation Plan to formalize and follow public outreach strategies to involve the populace in transportation planning decisions. Over the past several years, SBCAG has implemented those strategies and has incorporated new strategies into the mix. In response to the passage of the Safe, Accountable, Flexible and Efficient Transportation Equity Act – A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU), SBCAG updated its Public Participation Plan in 2007. The current Public Participation Plan includes updates in response to passage of the Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (MAP-21) to reflect current and future public involvement efforts of the agency in response to federal guidelines and requirements.

Section II. COMPLIANCE WITH FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS (MAP-21)

The Santa Barbara County Association of Governments Public Participation Plan was originally adopted in 1992 following the requirements of the 1991 Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act (ISTEA). In 1998, ISTEA was succeeded by the Transportation Efficiency Act for the 21st Century (TEA-21), which was subsequently succeeded by the Safe, Accountable, Flexible and Efficient Transportation Equity Act – A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) on August 10, 2005. Most recently, the Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21) was signed into law on July 6, 2012. TEA-21, SAFETEA-LU and MAP-21 continue the strong federal emphasis on public participation from the 1991 ISTEA, requiring the public participation plans of metropolitan transportation planning processes “shall be developed in consultation with all interested parties and shall provide that all interested parties have reasonable opportunities to comment on the contents of the transportation plan.”

As outlined in the federal legislation, methods to accommodate these goals, to the maximum extent possible, include:

- (i) holding any public meetings at convenient and accessible locations and times;
- (ii) employing visualization techniques to describe plans; and
- (iii) making public information available in electronically accessible format and means, such as the World Wide Web, as appropriate to afford reasonable opportunity for consideration of public information.

Metropolitan public participation or involvement processes shall be coordinated with statewide public involvement processes wherever possible to enhance public consideration of the issues, plans and programs and reduce redundancies and costs.

A key change between ISTEA/TEA-21 and SAFETEA-LU is the expanded definition of participation by “interested parties.” Broadly defined, SBCAG includes its partners, groups, and individuals who are affected by or involved with transportation in Santa Barbara County and the surrounding region. Examples include citizens, affected public agencies, representatives of public transportation services, private providers of transportation, representatives of users of public transportation, representatives of users of pedestrian walkways and bicycle transportation facilities, representatives of the disabled, and other interested parties with a reasonable opportunity to comment on the transportation plan.

SAFETEA-LU and MAP-21 require that public meetings be held at convenient and accessible times and locations, that all plans and the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) are available on a website, and that documents will be written in easily understandable language that utilizes visual components. These elements are addressed in Section IV of this plan.

SBCAG's public participation process satisfies the public participation requirements of the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) grantees for the FTA Section 5307 Program of Projects (POP).

Section III. OBJECTIVES

The Santa Barbara County Association of Governments shall provide for public involvement and participation consistent with the following objectives and strategies in the development of its short and long-range transportation plans, programs, and projects.

Objective 1: Raise the level of understanding of the transportation planning process in the region and identify how interested citizens can participate.

Objective 2: Maximize opportunities for public involvement in the transportation planning process.

Objective 3: Maintain contact with interested citizens and key stakeholders throughout the process of developing MPO plans and projects.

Objective 4: Be responsive to citizens.

Objective 5: Involve traditionally under-served persons – those who are minority, low-income or elderly or those addressed by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) in transportation planning issues.

Objective 6: Inform and educate incoming SBCAG Board members, local council members/supervisors and advisory committee members regarding the MPO's functions, responsibilities, and programs.

Section IV. DESCRIPTION OF PUBLIC PARTICIPATION/INVOLVEMENT ACTIVITIES

Before members of the public can give input on SBCAG programs, they must be aware of what SBCAG is and what issues are under consideration. To raise public awareness, SBCAG uses several strategies:

PUBLICATIONS

SBCAG has developed an agency brochure, in both English and Spanish, which highlights the main programs of the organization.

WEBSITE

SBCAG offers information about the agency, its programs and projects, and events via the internet at www.sbcag.org. This site is also linked to other Santa Barbara County jurisdictions. Users can ask questions and leave public comments. Staff follows up with responses to these comments. SBCAG's Traffic Solutions offers a dedicated site at www.trafficsolutions.info for commuters traveling in and out of Santa Barbara County on the variety of transportation and transit options available with links to other transit sites and park-and-ride lots as well.

MEDIA RELATIONS

Board meeting agenda packets are electronically circulated to regional media outlets in order for them to be informed of the issues that the SBCAG board considers and acts on during their monthly Board meeting held the third Thursday of each month. Staff will continue to be responsive to press information requests in a timely fashion.

It is important for members of the public to know when SBCAG is seeking their input. For this reason, press releases for public meetings, hearings or workshops are issued to a regularly updated e-mail distribution list, including local daily and weekly newspapers, websites, radio and television stations. SBCAG also has a Public Information Officer, who provides direct media liaison on SBCAG activities.

SPEAKERS BUREAU

SBCAG proactively schedules speaking engagements for staff through its Speakers Bureau. Service clubs, community and business organizations are a few of the venues where SBCAG staff and Board members speak to the public about SBCAG programs and projects. Fact sheets, talking points and visual displays are utilized to help articulate the message at hand.

EVENTS

SBCAG staff participates in a number of events during the course of the fiscal year, which helps increase awareness of the agencies activities and its role in the community. These events include, among others, Earth Day, CycleMania and the Green Business Awards.

OPEN HOUSES/WORKSHOPS

When SBCAG is presenting agency plans or programs or working with local jurisdictions on specific transportation projects or programs, open houses workshops are held to present background information on needs/issues and discuss alternatives to gain early input of nearby residents and the community. These open houses and workshops have been effective in receiving useful public comment. Handouts, display boards and technical staff provide information on the project or program. Individuals are encouraged to make comments to staff or write their thoughts on comment cards. Open houses and workshops are held for several hours and on large projects or programs in the four subregions of the County (the South Coast, the Santa Ynez Valley, the Lompoc Valley and the Santa Maria Valley) to accommodate a variety of schedules and to facilitate participation by members of the public from all areas of the county.

GEOGRAPHIC DIVERSITY

Santa Barbara County is large. To accommodate the geographic diversity of the County, the SBCAG Board alternately meets in Santa Maria and Santa Barbara. Remote testimony is available from each location so members of the public do not need to travel to the opposite end of the County to testify before the Board. SBCAG Advisory Committee meetings are often held in Buellton, a central county location and agency workshops and other meetings are frequently held in Santa Barbara, Santa Maria, Lompoc and Solvang, the main subregions of Santa Barbara County.

ACCESSIBILITY

Per the Americans with Disability Act, all SBCAG Board and committee meetings are physically accessible and persons needing special accommodations to participate in the meeting will be accommodated upon request. This information is included in every SBCAG meeting agenda.

TRANSLATION OF PUBLIC NOTICES

When requested or deemed appropriate, SBCAG will translate public notices and press releases into Spanish. All SBCAG display advertisements in English language publications include reference to a contact phone number in Spanish. Factors considered in determining whether Spanish language translation is appropriate include expressed interest by Spanish speakers, ethnicity of populations impacted, project or program purpose and need and expected effectiveness of reaching Spanish speaking populations.

SBCAG also distributes notices of planning documents and news releases to organizations that represent minority organizations that share information and are a resource for particular demographic groups, including Southeast Asian, Native American, Hispanic and African American.

OUTREACH FOR PLANNING DOCUMENTS

There are a number of planning documents that SBCAG creates and publishes for which this Public Participation Plan outlines a specific public process. Since these documents are regularly updated, the public and reviewing agencies can expect the processes outlined below to be followed consistently.

Unmet Transit Needs (UTN) Report. SBCAG is responsible for allocating Transportation Development Act funds under State law and for making findings following a public input process regarding the existence of unmet transit needs. The UTN report is developed and published annually in the spring after an effort to collect public input regarding transit needs, especially in north Santa Barbara County. (All TDA funds in south county are already spent only on transit and SBCAG's role is limited to determining the existence of unmet transit needs in areas where TDA funds are used for non-transit purposes.) Opportunities for public participation in the development of the UTN report include:

- SBCAG public hearing to solicit input on unmet transit needs
- UTN workshops across the County hosted by local transit agencies
- 30-day comment period on Draft UTN Report
- Public Hearing on Draft UTN Report
- SBCAG Board adoption of the Final UTN Report
- Occasional surveys distributed in north county

Transportation Planning Documents. For the Regional Transportation Plan, Federal Transportation Improvement Program, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), the California Division provides the Central Coast region with specific outreach requirements. The following participation process is consistent with those definitions and requirements. For more detailed information about FHWA guidance, please contact SBCAG staff.

Regional Transportation Plan (RTP). The RTP is generally updated every four years consistent with SAFETEA-LU, MAP-21 and State law requirements, with a limited number of amendments as needed in the intervening years. Opportunities for public participation for the RTP are different for RTP updates versus RTP amendments. RTP updates include significant revisions to the RTP document, while RTP amendments are generally specific to project scopes, schedules, or costs.

Outreach for RTP Updates:

Public meetings, workshops, and surveys during the RTP development period to solicit public dialogue and comment on the RTP process including, but not limited to issues such as:

- Overview of the planning process
- RTP goals, objectives, performance indicators
- RTP project lists
- RTP funding scenarios

Legally noticed public comment period on the Draft RTP Update. The length of the public comment period is aligned with the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and other State law. CEQA generally requires:

- 30-days if RTP Update does not include a new Programmatic Environmental Impact Report.
- 45-days if the RTP Update includes a new Programmatic Environmental Update Report.

In addition, SB 375 requires preparation of a Sustainable Communities Strategy (SCS) or Alternative Planning Strategy (APS) as part of the RTP and circulation for a minimum of 55 days before adoption of the RTP. This State law also prescribes certain procedural steps and adoption of a public participation plan specific to the preparation of the SCS or APS. Outreach for RTP Amendments:

RTP Amendments are generally triggered by a project-specific need to be consistent either with the project's environmental document or the Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP). As such, the public participation process for RTP amendments follow the requirements as outlined for the FTIP below, as applicable.

Federal Transportation Improvement Program.

The FTIP will need to be amended periodically following its adoption to reflect changes in the program including project additions, deletions and revisions. All requests to amend the FTIP must be submitted by the project-sponsoring agency. The request must clearly identify the proposed modifications and include all of the relevant programming information, such as the project description and scope, costs by project phase and program year, and the funding sources and amounts. SBCAG will consider amendment requests only if the proposed changes will not adversely affect the financial constraints findings of the FTIP. Proposed additions or changes to projects must also be consistent with the rules of the particular funding program involved.

The FTIP is usually updated every two years, with amendments occurring as needed. Federal requirements and SBCAG policy distinguish between two types of FTIP amendments—formal amendments and administrative amendments—which differ based on the magnitude of the proposed change and the level of review required by various federal, state and local agencies. Generally, significant changes to the cost scope or schedule of a project listing require a formal amendment. These formal amendments must be approved by the SBCAG Board as well as by Caltrans, FTA and FHWA.

Minor project changes, including its funding sources, description, a lead agency change, scheduling adjustments, and other items may be approved as an administrative amendment to the FTIP. Approval of administrative amendments has been delegated to the SBCAG Executive Director, and as a result, its streamlined procedure bypasses several steps in the amendment process, and generally expedites the approval timeframe by two to three months. All other amendments require formal approval by the SBCAG Board.

Administrative amendments must be consistent with the approved FTIP financial plan and changes in funding must be accommodated within the available resources identified in the plan. Administrative amendments are minor changes that:

- Revise a project description without changing the project scope or conflicting with the environmental document;
- Revise the funding amount listed for a project's phases. Additional funding is limited to the lesser of 40 percent of the project cost or \$10 million;
- Change the source of funds;
- Splits or combines individually listed projects; as long as cost, schedule and scope remain unchanged;
- Changes required information for grouped project listings; or
- Adding or deleting projects from grouped project listings as long as the funding amounts stay within the guidelines in the second bullet above.

Administrative amendments can be processed in accordance with these procedures provided that:

- They do not affect the air quality conformity determination, including timely implementation of Transportation Control Measures (SBCAG is presently an air quality maintenance area and does not prepare a conformity determination), and
- It does not impact financial constraint.

Amendments whose scale, type or other aspect precludes use of the administrative amendment option are processed as formal amendments. Formal amendments require SBCAG Board approval via resolution, and subsequent concurrence by Caltrans, the FHWA and FTA. At the discretion of the Executive Director, SBCAG may require that administrative amendments be treated as a formal amendment for amendments that are controversial or that are determined to be not clearly within the scope of an administrative amendment.

Currently the approval process for a project-related amendment to the FTIP lasts from thirty to sixty days, which can delay projects from advancing on schedule. Generally, projects that are amended in the FTIP require approval as formal amendments by SBCAG through adoption of a resolution and approval by Caltrans, FHWA, and FTA.

Federal regulations (23 CFR 450.332) require that SBCAG adopt procedures to expedite the amendment process for certain projects within the FTIP and require the annual listing of obligated projects. Projects that are eligible to use this process are:

1. Financially constrained and have been determined by MPO staff to be administrative in nature.
2. Do not need an adopted MPO Board resolution.

Utilizing the expedited procedures is optional for the project sponsor and SBCAG. Projects may still be amended using the regular FTIP amendment process.

Measure A Expenditure Plan or Ordinance.

SBCAG is designated as the Local Transportation Authority for Santa Barbara County and is responsible for administering the revenues generated by Measure A, a voter-approved ½% sales tax for transportation. An expenditure plan and ordinance implementing Measure A have been approved by the SBCAG Board. Pursuant to state law, any amendments to the expenditure plan require approval by two-thirds of the SBCAG Board and cannot take effect until after a 45-day review period.

SBCAG Public Participation Plan

Major revisions to the SBCAG Public Participation Plan include a 45-day public review period and public hearing. In addition, in response to federal requirements under SAFETEA-LU and MAP-21, revision of the Public Participation Plan shall include outreach efforts as described in Appendix D.

The drafts of the documents described above are posted on www.sbcag.org and mailed and deposited in a public library in each city (Santa Barbara County) for public review.

Please see Appendix A for a Summary Schedule of Public Notices and Public Hearings.

PERIODIC PUBLIC WORKSHOPS

SBCAG holds public workshops to allow individuals to ask questions and give their opinions outside of the regular Board or committee meetings. Past forums have included topics such as 101 in Motion, Measure A, SBCAG's Sustainable Communities Strategy and the Regional Growth Forecast. Workshops are also held during the planning process for the Regional Transportation Plan, the Federal Transportation Improvement Program, and other plans of special interest. SBCAG uses visualization techniques to present information in a non-technical manner.

PUBLIC HEARINGS, PUBLIC WORKSHOPS, PUBLIC COMMENTS

Public hearings or workshops are also offered in order to give more attention to a specific item. SBCAG uses visualization techniques to present information in a non-technical manner. Hearings and workshops are held at an early stage in the process so that suggestions can be integrated into the final proposal. All significant comments made using any of these means of public comment will receive due consideration, a formal response and will be included in the final document. In compliance with the Brown Act, all committee and Board hearings have, at a minimum, a formal public comment period. Agendas for Board meetings are posted at a minimum 72 hours prior to the meeting. However, in most cases, Board agendas are posted five days before the scheduled meeting.

ACCESSIBILITY TO INFORMATION

Once members of the public decide to get involved in local decision making, they should have easy access to information and the public comment process. The following strategies are designed to improve the public's access to SBCAG meetings and materials.

WRITTEN MATERIALS

A wealth of written information on SBCAG's activities is available on an ongoing basis. When preparing these documents, staff's goal is to make the information understandable to the average person in the community, to make the documents as concise as possible, to reduce or eliminate jargon and to explain acronyms. For staff reports, a brief background and a discussion section are included to give proper context on an issue. Plans and all handouts and other documents for public review include an executive summary, pictures, graphs, maps and/or other visual aids to make them more reader-friendly and understandable.

ACCOMMODATIONS

Currently, every effort is made to schedule public events at a location accessible by transit and all buildings for public events are ADA accessible for wheelchair users. Interpreters or other auxiliary aids will be arranged for the public event if requested prior to the meeting. Public meeting times vary between day and evening meetings depending upon the actual meeting location and /or topic. Some public hearings are held in conjunction with SBCAG's monthly board meeting which rotates between north and South County.

HOTLINES

Staffed and electronic hotlines are utilized as a public outreach tool and included in printed outreach material and on project websites in order to receive comments from the public.

BOARD MEETINGS

All agenda materials are currently available to the public at the Board meeting. Prior to the meeting, agendas are posted on the SBCAG website at www.sbcag.org. All staff reports distributed to the Board are also posted on the website in advance and made available to the public at the meetings. The schedule of upcoming committee or Board meetings are posted on the website and Board and committee meeting notices are also posted outside the SBCAG office.

Opportunities are available for public comment on items on or off the agenda. Cards in both English and Spanish are provided for members of the public to indicate which agenda items they wish to speak on; these cards can be turned in to staff members. At public hearings, the Chairperson invites members of the audience to share their comments on the issue at hand. For items not on the agenda, "a public comment" period is held early in the meeting, after roll call.

Section V. OUTREACH TO TRADITIONALLY UNDERSERVED GROUPS

Federal requirements for public participation plans include a process for seeking out and considering the needs of those traditionally underserved by existing transportation systems, such as low-income and minority groups.

Representatives of low income communities have pointed out that these individuals are often required to work two jobs in order to survive financially and public meetings are often difficult to attend. However, when a project affects them directly, they can be very interested. SBCAG works with community organizations to assist in outreach to low income and minority groups. SBCAG has compiled and routinely updates an Environmental Justice Resource List to use as a source for outreach. Please refer to **Appendix B** for the Environmental Justice Resource List.

TITLE VI NONDISCRIMINATION POLICY AND PROGRAM

Under Title VI of the 1964 Civil Rights Act, federally funded projects and programs are required to create and adhere to an adopted nondiscrimination policy. SBCAG's adopted Title VI Program, incorporated herein by reference, satisfies these requirements and assures that no person is excluded from participation in, denied the benefits of, or discriminated against under its projects, programs or activities on the basis of race, color or national origin. The Title VI program includes a Limited English Proficiency Plan.

EXECUTIVE ORDER 13166, LIMITED ENGLISH PROFICIENCY

This Executive Order directs federal agencies, recipients and sub-recipients of federal financial assistance to examine services they provide, identify any need for services to those with limited English proficiency (LEP), and develop and implement a system to provide services so that LEP persons have meaningful access to them. SBCAG adopted a LEP Plan as part of the Title VI Program on June 19, 2014.

SANTA BARBARA COUNTY TRANSIT ADVISORY COMMITTEE

SBCAG reaches out to transit-dependent communities through the Santa Barbara County Transit Advisory Committee. The committee's purpose is to recommend transit services that should be provided to the transit-dependent community, which often includes low-income individuals, as well as the elderly and disabled. The SBCTAC also advises the SBCAG Board on other transit issues, such as the coordination of specialized transportation services. As key plans are being developed, the SBCTAC are briefed by SBCAG staff for their input into the planning process. Their comments are presented to the SBCAG Board for their review.

TRIBAL GOVERNMENT

SBCAG works with the Santa Ynez Band of Chumash Indians. SBCAG Board members periodically meet with representatives of the Chumash Tribal Administration to discuss issues of mutual concern.

Chumash Tribal Administration staff have also attended SBCAG's TTAC, TPAC and Measure D Citizens Oversight Committee meetings, and other committee meetings as they deem necessary.

RESOURCE AGENCIES

SBCAG engages resource agencies to the extent practicable in the development of agency plans, specifically RTP development, by distributing notifications of updates to the RTP and FTIP. These agencies include federal, state, local, and tribal agencies responsible for planned growth, economic development, environmental protection, airport operations, freight movements, land use management, natural resources, conservation and historic preservation. The Resource Agency Listing for state and federal resource agencies is maintained by the California State Department of Transportation, Division of Transportation Planning and updated periodically. SBCAG adds local organizations and contacts to this list and updates it as necessary. Please see **Appendix C** for the current Resource Agencies listing.

SOCIAL SERVICE ORGANIZATIONS, CHURCHES, SCHOOLS & OTHER NON-TRADITIONAL SOURCES

SBCAG will continue to strive to expand its noticing and outreach efforts to include social service organizations, community service non-profit organizations, churches, high schools and college newspapers and other nontraditional outreach opportunities as identified including web-based information sources, social media and public access television.

Section VI.COMMITTEES THAT CONTRIBUTE TO PLANNING PROCESS

SBCAG STANDING COMMITTEES

The SBCAG Board relies on several committees for input on proposed plans, programs and actions that assist in its planning and decision-making. All of these committees are open to the public, with posted agendas in accordance with state law (Brown Act).

TECHNICAL TRANSPORTATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Technical Transportation Advisory Committee (TTAC) consists of staff representatives from the County of Santa Barbara, the eight incorporated cities in Santa Barbara County, Caltrans, Santa Barbara County Air Pollution Control District, Santa Barbara Metropolitan Transit District (SBMTD), and SBCAG. Non-voting, ex-officio members include FHWA, FTA, Vandenberg Air Force Base (VAFB), and University of California Santa Barbara. While SBMTD is the only special district transit agency on TTAC, the city representatives for Guadalupe, Lompoc, and Santa Maria represent their transit agencies that are operated by their own agencies. The committee reviews SBCAG transportation plans and programs and advises the SBCAG Board.

TECHNICAL PLANNING ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Technical Planning Advisory Committee (TPAC) is comprised of staff representatives of the County of Santa Barbara, the eight incorporated cities, Santa Barbara County Air Pollution Control District, and SBCAG. Additional non-voting, ex-officio members represent Vandenberg AFB, the Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO), the County's Housing Program and the University of California at Santa Barbara (UCSB). The committee reviews land use plans and programs and advises the SBCAG Board.

SANTA BARBARA COUNTY TRANSIT ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Santa Barbara County Transit Advisory Committee (SBCTAC) is comprised of representatives from fixed route transit and paratransit providers, social service agencies, non-profit groups providing social services, and transit users. The committee advises the Board on transit issues.

SINGLE ISSUE TASK FORCES

Single Issue task forces, such as the 101 in Motion Technical Advisory Committee and Citizens Advisory Group, the North County Transit Plan Advisory Committee and the Highway 154 Truck Safety Committee, provide guidance throughout the development of specialized plans or programs. The use of a single issue task force is considered when SBCAG is developing a plan or examining an issue with a high level of community interest. These task forces are broad-based, representing a range of interested parties. Meetings are open to the public. Members help set the goal of the study or plan and provide review and comment throughout the planning process. Facilitators may be brought in to assist group members in reaching consensus.

Section VII. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION PLAN MEASURES OF EFFECTIVENESS

The strategies contained in the Public Participation Plan will be reviewed annually to determine if modification of any particular strategy is necessary or if additional strategies need to be incorporated into the plan. Evaluation tools to measure effectiveness in terms of reaching desired demographic groups or attaining stated goals will also be employed. Evaluation strategies and measures of effectiveness include, but are not limited to the following criteria:

Percentage of meetings held at easily accessible locations within the county	100%
Percentage of meetings held in compliance with Americans with Disabilities Act requirements	100%
Percentage of SBCAG Board Meetings that are linguistically accessible with three working days advance request for reasonably available translation	100%
Number of Public Notices published annually (newspaper, website, etc.)

Number and variety of opportunities for public involvement (Public Meetings, Workshops & Events)	
Number of public comments at SBCAG Board, Board Committee & Advisory Committees	
Number of individuals and groups on e-mail and mailing list	
Number of Bike Maps distributed as well as any other sponsorship or advertisement opportunity	
Number of meetings broadcast or rebroadcast on Public Access televisions	
Number of visitors to the MPO website analyzed by specific pages	
Number of comments on TIP, UPWP, RTP, PPP	
Number of Advisory Committee Members, and their ethnic status	
Number of low literacy or foreign language documents produced	
Number of targeted public organizations participating in Board or Advisory Committee meetings	
Participant satisfaction measured annually via an online survey available on the SBCAG website and by a form available at every SBCAG sponsored Public Meeting.

Appendix D: PUBLIC PARTICIPATION PROCESS

The draft plan was available for public review from May 16, 2015 to August 20, 2015. The deadline for receiving written comments on the plan was July 7, 2015. A minimum public comment period of 45 calendar days is required before the revised participation plan is adopted by the MPO. The May 16 – July 7th circulation period is 53 days and exceeds the minimum required circulation period. The document was available to the public for a total of ninety seven days from the date the plan was posted on the SBCAG website until its approval by the SBCAG Board. In addition, public comments have been accepted during the formal public review period at the SBCTAC, TTAC and TPAC meetings, the SBCAG Board hearings on June 18th, July 16th and when the Board adopted the plan on August 20, 2015.

Display advertisements noticing the public availability of the Draft Public Participation Plan were run in newspapers in Santa Barbara, Santa Maria, Lompoc, and the Santa Ynez Valley during the week of May 24th. In addition, press releases were sent to regional media and e-mail notices were sent to SBCAG's e-mail list to announce the start of the Public Participation Plan Update process. Notice of the availability of the Draft Plan for public comment were posted on the SBCAG website continuously from May 21 through the August 20, 2015 SBCAG Board adoption.

SBCAG's Advisory Committees (SBCTAC, TTAC & TPAC) reviewed the document and offered suggested changes. The Draft Public Participation Plan was sent to SBCAG's Environmental Justice and Resource Agency List with a letter requesting comments on the Draft Plan by July 7, 2015.

SBCAG staff also solicited comments on the draft plan from members of the public, local agencies, FTA/FHWA, Caltrans, TTAC, TPAC, SBCTAC and the SBCAG Board. The plan was amended to address the comments received.

Appendix E: COMMENTS ON PLAN

This section will include summaries of the comments received on SBCAG's Draft Public Participation Plan and the suggestions will be addressed in the document on the noted pages.

The Santa Barbara County Air Pollution Control District (SBCAPCD) requested the agency be added to the Public Participation Plan's List of Resource Agencies on page 19. The SBCAPCD has been added to the list.

Expedited Project Selection Procedures

Title 23 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) section 450.328 allows for the movement of projects within the period of the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and Federal Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (FSTIP) subject to procedures agreed to by partnering agencies, including the state and transit operators within the region. SBCAG, as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for the Santa Barbara County Region has entered into an Expedited Project Selection Process outlined in the 23 CFR section 450.332 with Caltrans. The projects listed within the TIP have all been selected based on the regulations in 23 CFR Part 450. Federal Regulation 23 CFR section 450.332 allows for the movement of projects within the TIP/FSTIP subject to procedures agreed to by the partnering parties. This procedure is outlined below.

All movements must be consistent with the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) and must comply with the provisions of Title VI, must not negatively impact the deliverability of other projects in the regional programs, and must not affect the financial constraints finding of the TIP. For projects within the State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP), SBCAG will move projects subject to amendment or allocation approval by the California Transportation Commission (CTC). Caltrans may move projects in the State Highway Operations Protection Program (SHOPP) document within the TIP/FSTIP period without amending the TIP (with notification to SBCAG), providing that the action is consistent with the CTC-approved SHOPP program.

Caltrans Division of Local Assistance has implemented a project selection process for the Highway Bridge Program (HBP), Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP), Section 130 Rail Program, Hazard Elimination Safety (HES) program, and Active Transportation Program (ATP). The process was developed in cooperation with the implementing agencies, FHWA, the MPOs, and HBP Advisory Committee. Caltrans, SBCAG and the transit operators agree that the Caltrans Division of Local Assistance may move projects within the HBP, HES and Section 130 Rail Program within the TIP/FSTIP period without amending the TIP, with notification to SBCAG.

For FTA administered funds, projects may be moved within the period of the TIP/FSTIP at the request of the transit agency, as long as funding is available and the change does not negatively impact the delivery or availability of funds for other projects ready for obligation.

Implementing agencies wishing to advance projects using their own local funds until federal funds are available (only projects within the first 4 years of the TIP) may request Advance Construction Authorization (ACA) from Caltrans, or pre-award authority from FTA to proceed with the project using local funds until OA and apportionment becomes available.

Any public agency with public transit capital and operating funding needs within, to/from, or between urbanized area(s) in Santa Barbara County may apply for FTA 5307 funding according to the following process.

1. The California Department of Transportation serves as the Designated Recipient of FTA 5307 funding for Small Urbanized Areas in the state of California.
2. The Santa Barbara County Association of Governments (SBCAG) as the Metropolitan Planning Organization for Santa Barbara County administers the FTA 5307 program and includes projects funded by Federal Transit Administration funding in the Federal Transportation Improvement Program. SBCAG also approves the Project Selection Procedures and selected projects for Small Urbanized Areas in Santa Barbara County. Those Small Urbanized Areas per the 2020 Census include the Lompoc and Santa Maria Urbanized Areas.
3. At the beginning of every programming cycle, SBCAG shall notify each transit operator of the estimated amount of funding to be apportioned to each urbanized area for the fiscal years included in the programming cycle. The amount of funding available for this programming cycle is as follows:

4. The full amount of estimated FTA 5307 funding apportioned to an urbanized area shall be programmed to the urbanized area in the programming cycle.
5. SBCAG and transit operators will collaborate on the development of a project scoring system that will be adopted by the SBCAG Board of Directors ("SBCAG Board"). The scoring system shall prioritize projects for funding in each urbanized area on the basis of mobility needs and not use formulas or predetermined percentages to fund modes or jurisdictions, shall be selected from the approved Statewide Transportation Improvement Program. (23 CFR § 450.222(b).)
6. A call for projects will be issued by SBCAG and the Designated Grantees in each urbanized area according to the schedule shown in Attachment E, FTA 5307 Transit Project Selection Schedule.
7. Applicants must submit project information to the Designated Grantee in the urbanized area(s) in which they would like to operate a service or make a capital improvement.

Information provided must assist the Designated Grantee in evaluating the Scoring Criteria (Attachment B), the Screening Criteria (Attachment C, § 1), and the Selection Criteria (Attachment C, § 2) the project according to the scoring system developed. Applicants are encouraged to use the Project Submittal Sheet (Attachment D).

8. If the project involves more than one urbanized area, the applicant must provide copies of the project information to the Designated Grantees in each urbanized area that would benefit from the proposed project.
9. The Designated Grantee shall determine the project's eligibility for FTA 5307 funds according to the screening criteria in Attachment C.
10. The Designated Grantee shall score all projects that meet the screening criteria, including its own projects needing FTA 5307 funds, using the scoring system.
11. The Designated Grantee shall submit to SBCAG all applications received, including those that did not meet the screening criteria, its score for projects, and its policy board's adopted recommendation of which project(s) should be funded in the upcoming fiscal year(s) with the FTA 5307 grant apportionment published in the federal register for its urbanized area.
12. Any applicant may appeal any aspect of the Designated Grantee's screening and scoring of its application to SBCAG after the Designated Grantee's policy board has taken action but before SBCAG's Technical Transportation Advisory Committee (TTAC) has adopted a recommendation.
13. SBCAG staff will review all project information transmitted by Designated Grantees, including those that the grantee believes do not meet the screening criteria, and appeals filed, and recommend to SBCAG's TTAC concurrence or rejection of the Designated Grantee's funding recommendation.
14. SBCAG's TTAC committee shall adopt a recommendation of concurrence or rejection of a Designated Grantee's funding recommendation, which shall be communicated to the SBCAG Board.
15. If the SBCAG Board concurs with a Designated Grantee's funding recommendation, it shall approve an amendment to the Federal Transportation Improvement Program reflecting the funding recommendation and submit it to Caltrans and the Federal Transit Administration for its concurrence.
16. If the SBCAG Board rejects a Designated Grantee's funding recommendation, the recommendation shall be returned to the Designated Grantee with an explanation of the rejection. The Designated Grantee may modify and resubmit a funding recommendation. Rejection of a funding recommendation for one urbanized area will not necessarily

prevent SBCAG from adopting an FTIP amendment implementing recommendations for other urbanized areas.

17. The SBCAG Board reserves the right to modify these procedures in consultation with the Designated Grantees in each urbanized area at any time to promote the most efficient and effective use of FTA 5307 funding in Santa Barbara County.
18. This process shall be conducted consistent with federal and state laws and regulations and in such a way that all materials pertaining to the screening and scoring of projects, discussion of funding recommendations by policy boards, and staff reports to policy boards on any aspect of this process, shall be readily available to members of the public.

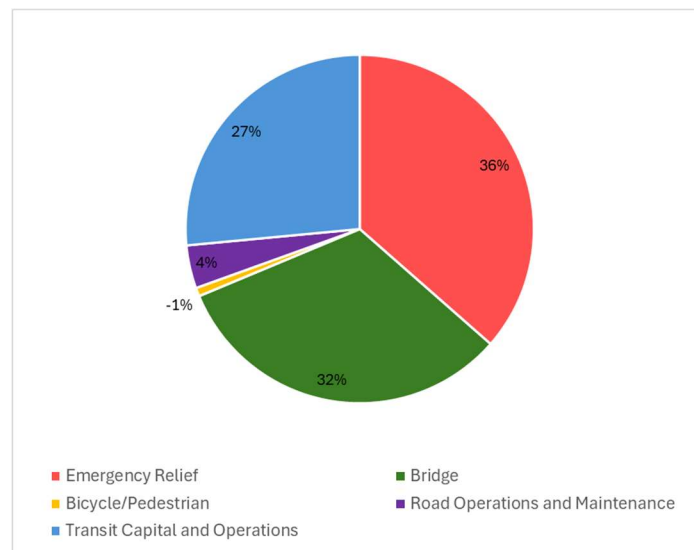

Federal law requires SBCAG to publish an annual list of projects for which federal funds have been obligated in the preceding year for public review, as a record of project delivery and a progress report for public information and disclosure.

This report indicates that approximately \$116 million in federal funds were obligated for 73 transportation projects in Santa Barbara County between October 1, 2024 and September 30, 2025. The federal funding consisted of \$84.8 million of Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) funds for road, bicycle/pedestrian facilities, transportation enhancements, and air quality projects and \$31.2 million in Federal Transit Administration (FTA) funds for transit projects.

**Appendix 10: FSTIP/FTIP Administrative Modification and
Amendment Procedures**

FSTIP/FTIP Administrative Modification and Amendment Procedures

December 18, 2019

The following procedures are applicable for processing amendments and administrative modifications to the Federal Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (FSTIP) and the Federal Transportation Improvement Programs (FTIPs).

Projects programmed in the FSTIP may be delivered in any of the recognized program years of the FSTIP provided Expedited Project Selection Procedures (EPSPs) have been adopted by the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) in accordance with 23 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 450 and the required interagency consultation or coordination is completed and documented. Changing the obligation year of a project using EPSP does not require an administrative modification or an amendment if the change does not require an air quality conformity determination.

1. Administrative Modification:

An administrative modification is a minor change to the FSTIP/FTIP that does not require a conformity determination, demonstration of fiscal constraint, public review and comment, or federal approval. The following changes to the FSTIP/FTIP can be processed through an administrative modification:

- i. Revise description of individually listed projects without changing the project scope or without conflicting with the approved environmental document;
- ii. Revise the description of grouped project listings, as defined in 23 CFR section 450.326 (h), if it is consistent with the Programming Grouped Project Listings in Air Quality Non-Attainment or Maintenance Areas guidance.
- iii. Revise the funding amount listed for a project or a project phase:
 - a. Additional funding to an individually listed project is limited to the lesser of 50 percent of the total project cost or \$20 million.
 - b. No limit on adding funds to a grouped project listing. Funding capacity must be available in the FSTIP/FTIP prior to processing programming changes and it must be stated in the supporting documentation.
(Note: Updated FTIP financial plans may be requested by Caltrans to validate fiscal constraint if an MPO has processed only administrative modifications for a period of six months or more.)
- iv. Program the Preliminary Engineering (PE) phase provided the Right of Way and/or Construction phase(s) are already programmed in the current FSTIP/FTIP and additional funding amounts stay within the limits specified in section iii.

- v. Change source of funds.
- vi. Change a project lead agency.
- vii. Program federal funds for advance construction conversion provided that programming capacity is available in the FSTIP/FTIP prior to programming the conversion.
- viii. Change the program year of funds within the current FSTIP/FTIP provided the MPO has an adopted EPSP that is developed in accordance with 23 CFR Part 450.
- ix. Split or combine an individually listed project or projects provided the schedule and scope remain unchanged.
- x. Add or delete a project or projects from a grouped project listing.
- xi. Program emergency repair projects on state and local highways caused by natural disasters or catastrophic failures from external causes that are not covered by the Emergency Relief Program and exempt from air quality conformity requirements.
- xii. Re-program a project for which FHWA funds were transferred to the FTA in a prior FSTIP/FTIP cycle but has not received grant approval from the FTA. Those projects can be programmed in the current FSTIP/FTIP through an administrative modification provided the original scope or cost remain unchanged. Use the type "FTA 5307 (FHWA Transfer Funds)" to program in the FSTIP/FTIP.
- xiii. Program an FTA-funded project from the prior FSTIP/FTIP cycle into the current FSTIP/FTIP provided the original scope or cost of the project remain unchanged. Use the project description field (or "CTIPS MPO Comments" section) to list the year, amount, and the prior year fund type.
- xiv. Make minor changes to an FTA-funded grouped project listing. Minor changes include changing the number of transit vehicles purchased by 20 percent or less and changing the fuel type of transit vehicles. The MPO must conduct an interagency consultation to confirm that the project scope change is deemed minor.

FSTIP/FTIP Administrative Modification and Amendment Procedures

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2. Amendment:

Amendments are all other modifications to the FSTIP/FTIP that are not included under the administrative modification and amendment procedures. All amendments shall be developed in accordance with the provisions of 23 CFR section 450.326 for each metropolitan area in the State, and in accordance with the provisions of 23 CFR section 450.218 for non-metropolitan areas.

3. Procedure:

a. Administrative Modification:

MPOs with approval delegation from Caltrans

Caltrans may delegate to an MPO's Board the authority to approve administrative modifications. In such case, Caltrans approval is not required. If an MPO Board further delegates the authority to the Executive Director to approve administrative modifications, copies of the delegation must be provided to Caltrans, the FHWA and FTA. The MPO must submit copies of the approved administrative modification to Caltrans, the FHWA and FTA. Once the MPO approves the administrative modification, changes will be deemed part of the FSTIP. The MPO is required to demonstrate in a subsequent amendment the net financial changes resulting from each administrative modification. Caltrans will conduct periodic review of each MPO's administrative modification process to confirm adherence to guidelines and procedures. Caltrans may revoke an MPO's delegation due to noncompliance with these procedures.

MPOs without approval delegation from Caltrans

Each MPO's administrative modification will be forwarded to Caltrans Division of Transportation Programming for approval. If an MPO Board delegates authority to the Executive Director to approve administrative modifications, copies of the delegation must be provided to Caltrans, the FHWA and FTA. The MPO must submit copies of the administrative modification to Caltrans, the FHWA and FTA. The MPO must also demonstrate in a subsequent amendment the net financial changes resulting from each administrative modification. Once Caltrans approves the administrative modification, changes will be deemed part of the FSTIP since federal approval is not required. Caltrans will notify the FHWA and FTA of the approved administrative modification. If Caltrans, the FHWA, or the FTA determines that changes in an administrative modification are not allowable under these procedures, the MPO must withdraw the administrative modification and process an amendment.

b. Amendment:

Amendments to the FSTIP must be developed in accordance with the provisions of 23 CFR 450, approved by the FHWA and/or the FTA in accordance with 23 CFR Part 450, and the July 15, 2004 MOU between FHWA - California Division and FTA Region 9. Each amendment must be forwarded to Caltrans Division of Transportation Programming for approval on behalf of the Governor. To expedite processing, the MPO must also submit the amendment to the FHWA and FTA at the same time. Once approved by Caltrans, the amendment will be forwarded to the FHWA and FTA for federal approval. The amendment will be deemed part of the FSTIP once it is approved by the FHWA and FTA. The FHWA and FTA will send the federal approval letter and respective conformity to Caltrans and the MPO.

4. Consultation:

If a question arises regarding the interpretation of these procedures, Caltrans, the MPO, the FHWA and/or FTA may consult to resolve the question. If after consultation the parties still disagree, the final decision rests with the FTA for transit projects and the FHWA for highway projects.

Any exception to these procedures is allowed only through a consultation process with MPOs, Caltrans, the FHWA, and FTA.

WHEREAS, Title 23 Code of Federal Regulations, part 450, and Title 49 Code of Federal Regulations, part 613, require the preparation and updating of a Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP) by the Metropolitan Planning Organization; and

WHEREAS, the Santa Barbara County Association of Governments (SBCAG) has been designated as the Metropolitan Planning Organization for Santa Barbara County; and

WHEREAS, SBCAG, through the conduct of a continuing, comprehensive, and coordinated transportation planning process with applicable federal requirements, has prepared a 2027 FTIP; and

WHEREAS, the 2027 FTIP has been prepared in cooperation with state and local government agencies including Caltrans, local transit operators; and the Air Pollution Control District; and

WHEREAS, the 2027 FTIP must be consistent with the Regional Transportation Plan adopted pursuant to Government Code Section 6508; and

WHEREAS, the 2027 FTIP projects have been developed from the 2010 Congestion Management Plan, 2025 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) and 2026 State Transportation Improvement Program; and

WHEREAS, all projects proposed for federal funding or approval under Title 23 Code of Federal Regulations and the Federal Transit Act must be included in a transportation improvement program; and

WHEREAS, because Santa Barbara County is not classified as a nonattainment or maintenance area for the federal eight-hour ozone standard, it is no longer required to follow air quality conformity measures nor the applicable State Implementation Plan (SIP) as required by

the federal Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. Section 7401 et seq.) and the EPA's transportation conformity regulations (40 CFR Part 93, subpart A). (23 CFR § 450.326(a).); and

WHEREAS, the 2027 FTIP was made available for public review and members of the public were given a reasonable opportunity to review the 2027 FTIP and a public hearing was held on August 20, 2026 to present the recommended 2027 FTIP and take testimony from the public (23 CFR § 450.326(b).); and

WHEREAS, the 2027 FTIP must be financially constrained and funds needed to complete the 2027 FTIP are reasonably expected to be available. (23 CFR §§ 450.326(k), 450.104).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the SBCAG Board of Directors adopts the 2027 FTIP on September 17, 2026; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the SBCAG Board of Directors finds that development of the 2027 FTIP was made in accordance with public involvement procedures originally adopted by SBCAG on November 10, 1994 and updated on March 24, 2002, December 20, 2007, October 20, 2011, August 20, 2015, and September 19, 2019 in accordance with Title 23, Code of Federal Regulations, section 450.316; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the SBCAG Board of Directors finds that 2027 FTIP is consistent with metropolitan planning regulations from 23 Code of Federal Regulations Part 450; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the SBCAG Board of Directors finds that the approved 2027 FTIP is consistent with the 2025 RTP; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the 2027 FTIP as approved is financially constrained, and funds needed to complete project in the 2027 FTIP are reasonably expected to be available; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that because Santa Barbara County is not classified as a nonattainment or maintenance area for the federal eight-hour ozone standard, the 2027 FTIP is not required to follow air quality conformity measures nor the applicable State Implementation

Plan (SIP) as required by the federal Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. Section 7401 et seq.) and the EPA's transportation conformity regulations (40 CFR Part 93, subpart A). (23 CFR § 450.326(a).); and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the inclusion of any federally-funded projects in the 2027 FTIP, including all amendments, constitutes the federal project selection procedures for Santa Barbara County, and any projects programmed in the FTIP may proceed to implementation without further project selection action by SBCAG.
